Mayor,

The Police Department has been approved to apply for the 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program. The solicitation for funding from this grant has several components that must be met in a timely manner. One of which is a public hearing which must be held within 30 days of the deadline for submission of the application. The deadline mentioned is June 16, 2015. I ask that a public hearing be held just prior to the regular City Council meeting on June 15, 2015. The following information will explain the grant funding and its expected use.

The grant allocation total for St. Clair County is One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Three Hundred Four dollars (\$125,304.00). These funds are divided by an allocation table designated by the US Government. St. Clair County, the City of Belleville and the City of East St. Louis are listed as being in a "disparate grouping" by the US Government and as such must have a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) signed between the units in order to apply for the grant. The funds are distributed based on the allocation table and the agreement between the three agencies. The St. Clair County Sheriff Department has not previously received any of the funds, however this year they have agreed to be the administrator of the grant and East St. Louis has agreed to give Thirty Thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) from their share to the Sheriff Department, the City of East St. Louis is now allocated Seventy-Nine Thousand One Hundred Thirteen dollars (\$79,113.00) and Belleville is allocated per the table Sixteen Thousand One Hundred Ninety One dollars (\$16,191.99).

The Police Department would propose the funds be used to purchase additional cameras and equipment for the expansion of the "Downtown Camera" project. The total cost for this project is estimated to be approximately Sixty Five Thousand dollars (\$65,000.00) and will be done in phases as funding becomes available to the Police Department.

I would request that this information be used for the public hearing as required by the grant regulations. If you have any questions in this matter, please feel free to contact me.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS – CITY HALL  
JUNE 1, 2015 – 7:00 PM**

Phil Silsby called this meeting to order.

Mayor Pro Tem Phil Silsby explained the disaster procedures. Mayor Pro Tem Phil Silsby reminded anyone speaking this evening to step up to a microphone because the meetings are being taped and posted the next day on the website.

Mayor Pro Tem Phil Silsby asked City Clerk Dallas B. Cook to call roll. Members present on roll call: City Clerk Dallas B. Cook and City Treasurer Dean Hardt. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

**Michael Hagberg, Belleville, Illinois**

There is an item on tonight's agenda dealing with the North Illinois Streetscape and it states it is a \$3,000,000 project. Mr. Hagberg stated in fairness to the taxpayers it should be researched by the Belleville News-Democrat or possibly let the aldermen know how much money the City has already spent on design, property acquisition, demolition and easements that is not being part of the \$3,000,000 to get a good feel for exactly how much it's going to cost even estimated upfront today's money, let alone something that happened on the previous streetscape which went terribly over budget and cost the taxpayers a lot more than they initially agreed to pay.

**Mike Hawthorne, Belleville, Illinois**

Mr. Hawthorne stated he is present representing the Oktoberfest. On Item 12-E under communications the Oktoberfest Committee is requesting the Oktoberfest be extended down to Jackson Street instead of stopping at "T" Street as previously done. Mr. Hawthorne stated they hoped the City had a second stage at Jackson and Main that will provide for local talent with both high schools German clubs plus some German music plus other dancers and what have you. There is no room for a timeframe on the main stage. Mr. Hawthorne is in hopes the council will support so they can keep the Oktoberfest large like last year and everyone will be happy.

**Andrea Powell, Belleville, Illinois**

Ms. Powell stated she hopes the council considers business that will be open during the hours of the Oktoberfest. Ms. Powell stated she does not understand why it cannot be expanded to North and South 159 to leave room for parking and business during the day. Last year, it was for the Belleville 200 and it was understood it was a one-time thing with the expansion going to Church Street. Ms. Powell stated this was previously approved to "T" Street; however, this was without knowledge.

**Frank Wagner, Belleville, Illinois**

Mr. Wagner stated he is present representing the Circle of Remembrance and is requesting two hours on Sunday. Mr. Wagner stated he contacted the businesses in the area and there will be no conflict.

**Beth Wamble, Belleville, Illinois.**

Ms. Wamble stated she is from Ben's, 112 East Main. Ms. Wamble requested the city council consider the businesses when they ask to close streets. Not just for this event but for every event. This hurts businesses when the streets are closed i.e. no parking. Ms. Wamble encourages they consider the use of the city parks or some other location besides downtown. Every time the streets are closed for an event, a run, a walk it really hurts the business.

**John Conkright, Belleville, Illinois**

Mr. Conkright stated anytime there is an event downtown and closes all the streets it hurts. Not just this event but all events in the future. Mr. Conkright stated in the past he has been criticized in the Belleville News-Democrat saying he was greedy, customers will not shop his store anymore. Mr. Conkright stated anytime they have to come and defend themselves on what they want to do there is recuperations from the people who are trying to organize the event. Mr. Conkright stated he can personally tell you as long he is involved they will not be back and ask. Mr. Conkright stated he would like to go on record for permanent that anytime the street is closed off it hurts his business. Furthermore, Mr. Conkright requested the council to look at the fact that when they close things off quite often they do it early and they take the signs down late i.e. Art on the Square...High Street was blocked off Thursday morning, on Sunday Main Street still had the barricades up. Every single event has a complication i.e. parking lots will be filled with workers.

When you look at the voting standards...who votes. You must take into consideration, although many people do not want to admit it but Ben's is the anchor downtown. If you go to the mall

they have four anchors and if those four stores are out voted by two hundred stores who get their way. Mr. Conkright stated he thinks his vote should count more than one because of what they do and who they are.

Last year, his fiscal year ended May 31<sup>st</sup> and he can show on paper where they spent over \$107,000 just in advertising promoting downtown and promoting their store. Mr. Conkright stated he can guarantee the other stores that are against Ben's and vote against the total of all of the retail stores, the bars and lawyers downtown don't spend that much money in a year's time. That does not include the money they spend on social advertising. Mr. Conkright stated he thinks his vote should be taken into consideration more than one which it doesn't happen in any of the meetings.

Once again, Mr. Conkright stated he is present to talk about all future events.

Synopsis:  
-----

On 09/04/2010 Deputies were dispatched to the anonymous report of an alcohol party with underage drinkers. I responded to the home where I observed known underage individuals consuming alcoholic beverages. Contact was attempted and the individuals locked themselves inside the residence. Three females were located in the basement and were found to be unresponsive and appeared to be in need of medical aid.

Due to the exigent circumstances surrounding the females condition, entry was made into the residence. The females were medically evaluated by EMS. Contraband was observed during the recovery of the females and warrants were written based on those observations. The warrants were served and evidence of alcohol consumption was located.

It was also found that a large marijuana cultivation operation was located in the garage and through out the residence. Evidence was collected and processed. Charges were referred to prosecution concerning all underage individuals for illegal consumption. The four male individuals who were present were also referred for the charge of Interference with Arresting Officer.

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## Initial Call:

On 09/05/2010 at 0045 hrs. Deputies were dispatched to the report of an loud party where underage individuals were reported to be consuming alcoholic beverages. Myself and Detective Eckles responded to the residence of [REDACTED]. I recognized the residence to be that of Bradley Rockwell and his son Jordan Rockwell.

I recognized that this was the Rockwell's residence due to a previous incident in which a gun, mp3 player, and some alcohol had been stolen from their residence. See case # 09UC09966

## Initial Observations:

Upon arrival to the residence Detective Eckles and myself made approach from half a city block away to prevent being detected. Detective Eckles made approach to the residence from the north side on Flower Street. I made approach from a pocket park that is adjacent to the residence on the west side of the home. From the pocket park I had an unobstructed view inside the kitchen area through the rear entry sliding glass door.

## Identified Jordan:

While waiting for additional Deputies to clear another detail and respond, I observed the individuals inside the kitchen area of the residence. I immediately recognized one of the individuals as Jordan Rockwell, who is known to me to be under the age of 21. I observed as Jordan was in the kitchen area of the home consuming the contents inside a Bud Light Beer can. Jordan was wearing a white tee-shirt and black hat. Jordan continued to clean up numerous consumed cans of Bud Light from throughout the kitchen and to dispose of them in a garbage bag.

## Identified Austin:

I also was able to identify another individual inside the home who was known to me as being under the age of 21. I observed as Austin Hansen consumed the contents of a Bud Light Can. Austin was dressed in grey pants, a green shirt, and a black hat. Austin was speaking with a female who appeared to be in her late teens. I watched as the female (identified as Kara Holbrook) consumed a glass of red drink out of what appeared to be a large margarita glass. Austin was known to me to be under the age of 21 due to a previous alcohol related incident in which I had arrested Austin for an Alcohol related offense. See case # 09UC11338.

## Contact from Anonymous RP:

While observing the individuals inside the residence I was approached by an individual who stated that they were the anonymous reporting party. The individual stated that just before we had arrived the group of individuals inside the residence were out side in the street playing around and making lots of noise. The reporting party also stated that they had witnessed the group consuming what they believed to be beer. The reporting party stated that the



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group was also taking some photographs with a camera. The reporting party stated that they believed that the owner of the residence was not at home and that it was all young individuals from what they could see at the party.

Additional Deputies:  
-----

A short while later Deputy Taylor and Deputy Boren arrived on scene to assist in scene security. Deputies Eckles and Taylor were stationed at the front door and Deputy Boren and myself were at the rear entrance to the residence. At that time I had Deputy Boren stay at the rear of the home and I responded to the front door. I arrived at the front entrance and could see Jordan, Austin and Kara all in the kitchen area cleaning up beer cans and talking.

Contact Attempted:  
-----

I attempted contact by knocking loudly on the front door. Jordan Rockwell came to the door and looked out the side light. He looked out at me for a few seconds but never opened the door. Jordan started to walk away from the door when I knocked again and announced that it was the Sheriff's Department. Jordan came to the door again and looked out the side light again. This time it appeared that Jordan saw that I was standing there on the doorstep. Jordan after making eye contact with me reached over and locked the dead bolt on the door. As Jordan turned around I heard him tell Kara that it was just a doorbell ditcher.

At that time I observed that Kara went down stairs to the basement where the others were hanging out. Jordan then ran to the back door and yelled to Austin that he needed to help him lock the back door because it was the cops. I observed as Austin and Jordan wrestled with the sliding glass door in the rear of the residence trying to get it locked. I continued to knock at the door and announce loudly at the front door that it was the Sheriff's Department and to open the door.

Jordan and Austin proceeded to ignore our commands to open the door. I observed as Jordan and Austin hid for several minutes in the kitchen area out of sight. They then got up and went through the home turning out some of the lights, securing windows and turning off the stereo. Jordan and Austin then went down stairs.

Call to Sergeant Keith:  
-----

I then contacted Sergeant Keith and explained the situation that we had at that point. I informed him that I had witnessed known underage individuals consuming alcoholic beverages inside the residence. I also informed him that when we had announced ourselves to the individuals inside, they had locked all doors and windows. Sergeant Keith stated that we should hold off and see if we can get them to open the doors on their own.

Continued Announcements:  
-----

I was able to secure the cell phone number of the owner of the property, Brad Rockwell, and attempted to contact him with several calls. All of the calls I made to Brads phone went unanswered and straight to voice mail. For the next

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approximately half hour we continued to knock at the front and rear entry doors trying to get the occupants of the home to answer the door.

Several times I observed an individual in a red shirt come to the top of the stairs to peak around the corner to see if we were still there. In that same time period the Deputies on scene checked all around the home for any movement and possible ways to make contact. While checking around the home Deputies Taylor and Boren were able to locate three females who were unresponsive.

Deputies Taylor and Boren used their flash lights on a strobe feature in trying to gain response from the females. The flashlight used was emitting a 120 lumens beam of light. While using the flashlight the Deputies were pounding on the window with their fists and boots in an attempt to again get the females to respond. These attempts to awaken the females continued for at least another fifteen minutes.

#### Medical Concern:

I made my way over to the south side of the home where Deputy Boren showed me where the three females were located. I then attempted to awaken the females by using my flashlight and pounding on the window. The females heads were less than three feet away from the window. I was alarmed to see that with the brightness of the lights, and the loudness of the knocking that no response from any of the females was observed.

I called Sergeant Keith and explained what was observed concerning the females condition. I informed him that I was concerned for the females due to the potential of alcohol poisoning and the unresponsive nature of the females. It was decided that entry into the residence needed to be made to check on the females status. I responded to the front of the home to explain the situation to Deputies Taylor and Boren.

#### Entry:

At this time only Deputies Taylor and Boren were with me at the scene. I stated that we needed to make entry into the home and that the easiest way would be through the garage if they had not locked the door into the residence. I was aware that the white truck in the front of the home belonged to the owner of the residence, Brad Rockwell. I noticed that inside the truck was a garage door opener. It was decided to access the residence through the garage in order to not cause damage to a door or window. The garage door opener was obtained from the truck and the garage door was opened.

#### Security Sweep:

Deputy Boren and myself made entry into the garage area of the home. Immediately upon entry into the garage I noticed an extremely strong odor of fresh marijuana. I shouted back to Deputy Taylor, who was securing the front of the home, that there was a lot of fresh marijuana somewhere close. It was found that the door from the garage into the home locked from the garage side. Deputy Boren unlocked the door and we entered the residence. Upon entry into the home I made three loud announcements informing the occupants of the residence that it was

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the Sheriff's Department and to come out with their hands up.

As I came to the top of the stair case I heard the sound of a window opening and some loud banging. At that time Deputy Taylor came inside the residence and notified me that there was possibly a marijuana grow inside the garage. We continued to clear the residence to check on the welfare of the females in the basement. Deputies Taylor, Boren, and I continued a security sweep of the home. It was found that a basement window in the rear of the residence had been opened and the male occupants in the home had left the area.

Contact with Females:

-----  
The last area checked was the basement bedroom on the south east side of the residence. As we entered the room it was noticed that the three females were still in the same positions as we had observed through the window. While entering the room loud announcements were made and commands were yelled. All three females were still completely unresponsive. I approached the bed and shook one of the females (Kaycee Neilson) trying to awaken her. The female was still unresponsive. I grabbed her by the wrist and pulled on her arm to gain a response. Kaycee, when moved to a different position finally started to respond but was very lethargic.

Deputies Taylor and Boren both did the same to the other females. Deputy Taylor attempted to move another female later identified as Cecily Airinios. Cecily was repositioned but slipped off the bed flopping onto the ground. Cecily remained completely unresponsive even after hitting the floor. Deputy Taylor then felt for a pulse and watched for breathing. Deputy Taylor was able to find a pulse and witnessed breathing. He then started to tap Cecily's face with the back of his hand. It took about a minute before any response was gained from Cecily.

Medical Evaluations:

-----  
After all three females were responsive they were escorted up the stairs and out of the residence for medical evaluation. Medical arrived on scene and evaluated the females and found their vital signs to be acceptable.

Warrant Service:

-----  
The scene was then secured and a search warrant was written. The affidavit for the warrant was written to search for and seize alcoholic beverages, bottles, cans, anything associated with the illegal consumption of alcohol, and any electronic evidence that could document the consumption of alcohol by individuals who were underage. Warrant No. 1055101 was approved by District Court Judge M. James Brady and served at the residence.

Seized Items:

Items Seized during the first warrant include photos of alcoholic beverage containers and a camera containing photos of the individuals who were present at the residence.

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## Incident Report 10UC10840

-----

Kara stated that she was invited to go to a house in Eagle Mountain by Kaycee Neilson. Kara said that they were going to go and hang out with some boys that Kaycee had recently meet. Kara stated that they had gone to the residence about 2330 that evening and that they were all hanging out up stairs in the kitchen. Kara stated that she was playing a game called "Kings Kup" in the kitchen with Kaycee, Cecily, Jordan, Cody, Austin, and she could not remember the name of the other male. Kara stated that all of the individuals named above were drinking while playing the game.

Kara stated that at that time she wanted some photos of the party so the group went outside to get her camera out of the vehicle. Kara stated that several photos were taken of the group outside as they played in the street. Kara stated that the group all went back inside and that was when the Cecily and Kaycee got tired and went down stairs with two of the boys.

Kara stated that she stayed up stairs in the kitchen for a little longer with Austin and Jordan. Kara stated that she heard a knock at the door and that one of the boys checked the door, Kara said she thought that it was someone doorbell ditching so she decided to go down stairs to go to sleep with the other two girls. Kara stated that when she came down stairs and mentioned that some one had knocked at the door, the two boys went up stairs to check it out. Kara stated that at that point all of the girls went to sleep down stairs.

## Statement by Kaycee Neilson:

-----

Kaycee stated that she had received a text from one of the boys at about 2230 hrs. to come over and hang out. She said that they did not make it out that way until around 2330 hrs. Kaycee stated that they started to play "Kings Cup". Kaycee said that after about half an hour or so they got tired and went down stairs to go to sleep.

Kaycee stated that after falling asleep that the next thing she remembers was being woke up by officers. Kaycee stated that she remembers that the officers took them outside to be checked by paramedics. Kaycee stated that she did not know the boys last names because she did not know them well. She did remember that their names were Jordan, Lionel, Cody, and Austin.

## Statement by Cecily Airinios:

-----

Cecily's statement was brief in nature. Cecily stated that she was with Kaycee and Kara when they got a text about a party. Cecily stated that it was sent from Lionel and Jordan. Cecily said that they went over to Jordan's house and played some drinking games. Cecily stated that she had gotten pretty intoxicated and went down stairs and fell asleep.

## Evidence:

-----

After the females were medically evaluated they were all administered portable breath tests. All three females tested positive for alcohol in their systems. Evidence located and obtained is as follows:



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Kara Holbrook- Positive PBT for alcohol, observed by Deputies consuming alcohol, statement of admission.

Kaycee Neilson- Positive PBT for Alcohol, photos of Kaycee at the party, vehicle at the scene, statement of admission.

Cecily Airinios- Positive PBT for Alcohol, photos of Cecily at the party, statement of admission.

Jordan Rockwell-

Alcohol possession-Observed by Deputies consuming an alcoholic beverage, photos of Jordan at the party, and statements placing him at the residence at the time of our arrival.

Cody Lockwood - Photos of Cody at the party, statement of admission, and statements placing him at the residence at the time of our arrival.

Austin Hansen- Observed by Deputies consuming an alcoholic beverage, photos of Jordan at the party, and statements placing him at the residence at the time of our arrival.

Lionel Peterson- Photos of Lionel at the party, and statements placing him at the residence at the time of our arrival.

The four male individuals were placed at the scene at the time the home was surrounded by the initial arriving officers. Statements by the females who were present had mentioned that Lionel and Cody were in the basement of the residence and that Austin was with Jordan upstairs at the time of our arrival. I could also confirm that Jordan and Austin were present at the time of our arrival by observing through the windows inside the residence.

Conclusion:

-----  
After the service of the initial warrant evidence pertaining to the illegal consumption of alcohol was gathered. The three females were issued citations and the four male individuals involved were referred to prosecutors for charges of Illegal Consumption and Obstruction/Interfering with an Officer Arrest.

This agreement made this 15th day of June, 2015 by and between the City of Belleville, Illinois (the "City") and Colee2, LLC ("Colee2, LLC"):

WHEREAS, Colee2, LLC intends on investing a minimum of \$120,000.00 to complete remodeling at the existing facility located at 15 North 1st Street in Belleville (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement in order to set forth the terms upon which the City would provide certain economic incentives for the Project and the terms upon which Colee2, LLC would provide jobs at said location.

### Responsibilities of the City of Belleville

1. Certification of project's location in Belleville Enterprise Zone for the Abatement of Sales Tax on Building Materials used exclusively for the remodeling and parking lot improvements (Savings estimated at \$4,050.00) at the existing facility located at 15 North 1st St.

### Responsibilities of Colee2, LLC

- A. Invest no less than \$120,000.00 at 15 North 1st St. limited to the remodeling and parking lot improvements at the facility no later than October 31, 2015, and;
- B. Colee2, LLC and any heirs and/or successors shall remain and operate at the site for no less than five (5) years, and;
- C. Compliance with all existing and applicable Federal, State, County and Local laws and ordinances.

### Miscellaneous

Neither party shall be bound by any terms, conditions, statements or representations, not herein contained. (AS AMENDED)**

This amended agreement made this 15th day of June, 2015 by and between the City of Belleville, Illinois (the "City") and **Cottages Limited Partnership ("Cottages Limited Partnership")**:

**WHEREAS, Cottages Limited Partnership** intends on investing a minimum of \$8,214,300.00 to complete the construction of a new senior living community, known as "The Cottages at Cathedral Square", located at 100 West Harrison Street in Belleville (the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS,** the parties have reached an agreement in order to set forth the terms upon which the City would provide certain economic incentives for the Project and the terms upon which **Cottages Limited Partnership** would provide jobs at said location.

**Responsibilities of the City of Belleville**

1. Certification of project's location in Belleville Enterprise Zone for the Abatement of Sales Tax on Building Materials used exclusively for the development of a senior living community (Savings estimated at \$81,000.00) located at 100 West Harrison Street.
2. Provide up to \$175,000.00 in TIF funds after completion of demolition and documentation of costs incurred has been received and approved by the City of Belleville.

**Responsibilities of Cottages Limited Partnership**

- A. Invest no less than \$8,214,300.00 at 100 West Harrison Street limited to the construction of a senior living campus no later than September 30, 2015, and;
- B. The Cottages at Cathedral Square and any heirs and/or successors shall remain and operate at the site for no less than five (5) years, and;
- C. Compliance with all existing and applicable Federal, State, County and Local laws and ordinances.

**Penalties**

In the event that **Cottages Limited Partnership** fails to meet its obligations under Sections (A), (B) or (C) of the section entitled "Responsibilities of **Cottages Limited Partnership**" of the Development Agreement, all public funds provided under (2) of the section entitled "Responsibilities of the City of Belleville" received to date as per the Development Agreement from the City of Belleville shall be repaid to the City of Belleville and all remaining amounts to be provided if any, shall be terminated.

### GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **ACCEPTANCE OF AGREEMENT** The terms and conditions of the agreement between the client and SCI ENGINEERING, INC. (hereinafter called SCI) are detailed below and have been established to allocate risks between both. For the purposes of convenience, the client may choose to orally authorize our service, in which case the client agrees that the verbal agreement constitutes formal acceptance of the terms and conditions detailed below. Subsequent to an agreement by both parties to perform the services, modifications to the terms and conditions are prohibited.

2. **SITE ENTRY** You, the Client, will provide for right of entry of SCI or employees of firms working under the direction of SCI, and all necessary equipment, in order to perform the work. Although SCI will exercise reasonable care in performing its services, the Client understands that use of testing or other equipment may unavoidably cause some damage, the correction of which is not part of this agreement. The client agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless SCI and its subconsultants against any damages, liabilities, or costs, arising or allegedly arising from procedures associated with testing or investigative activities. If you desire or require us to restore the site to its former condition, upon written request, we will perform such additional work as is necessary and you agree to pay all costs incurred.

3. **SUBSURFACE STRUCTURES OR UTILITIES** The Client will furnish to SCI information identifying the type and location of utility lines and other man-made objects beneath the site's surface. SCI will take reasonable precautions to avoid damaging these man-made objects. You agree to waive any claim against SCI, and to defend, indemnify and hold SCI harmless from any claim or liability for injury or loss allegedly arising from SCI's damaging underground utilities or other man-made objects that were not called to SCI's attention, or which were not properly located on plans furnished to SCI.

4. **SAMPLES** Soil, rock, water, or other samples obtained from the project site are your property. SCI shall preserve such samples for no longer than thirty (30) calendar days after the issuance of any document that includes the data obtained from them, unless other mutually agreed arrangements are documented.

Concrete test specimens will be discarded after testing. If project specification strengths are met, "hold" cylinders will be discarded at that time.

If in SCI's opinion any of the samples collected may be affected by regulated contaminants, SCI shall package such samples in accordance with applicable law and client shall arrange for lawful disposal procedures. SCI shall not, under this agreement, arrange for or be responsible for the disposal of substances affected by regulated contaminants. Furthermore, unless detailed in a specific work scope, SCI is not responsible for any soil cuttings or produced groundwater generated for the purpose of sample collection that may be affected by regulated contaminants that are left at a job site and were generated for the collection of soil and groundwater samples. SCI will, at the client's request, help the client identify appropriate alternatives for the off-site treatment, storage, or disposal of these materials, for additional fees.

#### 5. **GENERAL LIABILITY AND LIMITATION**

SCI agrees to hold you harmless and to indemnify you on account of any liability due to bodily injury or property damage arising directly out of our negligent operational acts, but such hold harmless and indemnity will be limited to that covered by our comprehensive general liability insurance. Our general liability

insurance, subject to its limits, terms and conditions, provides protection against liability arising out of bodily injury and property damage that is the direct result of our operational negligence. At your request, SCI will provide certificates evidencing such coverage and will purchase additional limits of liability that you may require as a separate cost item to be borne by you.

You shall not be liable to SCI and SCI shall not be liable to you for any consequential damages incurred by either due to the fault of the other, regardless of the nature of this fault, or whether it was committed by you or SCI, their employees, agents, or subcontractors. Consequential damages include, but are not limited to, loss of use, loss of profit, loss of business, loss of income, loss of reputation or any other consequential damage that any party may have incurred from any cause of action, including, but not limited to negligence, strict liability, breach of contract, or breach of warranty.

6. **SHARED RISK ALLOCATION** The Client and SCI agree to allocate certain of the risks so that, to the fullest extent permitted by law, SCI's total aggregate liability to the Client is limited to \$50,000.00 for any and all injuries, damages, claims, losses, expenses, or claim expenses (including attorney's and expert witness' fees) arising out of this AGREEMENT from any cause or causes. 7. **INVOICES** You will make all payments in accordance with SCI's invoices, and payment is due upon receipt of invoice. The discovery of unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous materials will constitute a changed condition mandating termination of services if SCI and you are unable to renegotiate the scope of service in a timely manner. SCI will notify you as soon

as practically possible should SCI encounter unanticipated hazardous or suspected hazardous materials.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

**Section 1.** To the extent and as required by the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (Act) (820 ILCS 130/1 et al.) regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by any public body and to anyone under contracts for public works, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of Belleville is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the St. Clair County areas as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor as of June of the current year, a copy of such determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As further required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Illinois Department of Labor shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the City of Belleville. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which have also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

**Section 2.** Noting herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the City of Belleville to the extent required by the Act.

**Section 3.** The City Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of the City Clerk this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

**Section 4.** The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association or employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

**Section 5.** The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Illinois Secretary of State Index Division and the Illinois Department of Labor.

**Section 6.** The City Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.

**Section 7.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication all as provided by law.

## Explanations

### ST. CLAIR COUNTY

LABORERS (NORTH) - The area bounded by Route 159 to a point south of Fairview Heights and west-southwest to Route 3 at Monroe County line.

PLUMBERS & PIPEFITTERS (SOUTHEAST) - That part of the county bordered by Rt. 50 on the North and West including Belleville.

PLUMBERS (NORTHWEST) - Towns of Aloraton, Brooklyn, Cahokia, Caseyville, Centreville, Dupo, East Carondelet, E. St. Louis, Fairview Heights, French Village, National City, O'Fallon, Sauget, and Washington Park.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

Oil and chip resealing (O&C) means the application of road oils and liquid asphalt to coat an existing road surface, followed by application of aggregate chips or gravel to coated surface, and subsequent rolling of material to seal the surface.

### EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

### CERAMIC TILE FINISHER AND MARBLE FINISHER

The handling, at the building site, of all sand, cement, tile, marble or stone and all other materials that may be used and installed by [a] tile layer or marble mason. In addition, the grouting, cleaning, sealing, and mixing on the job site, and all other work as required in assisting the setter. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

### ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.

### OPERATING ENGINEER - BUILDING

GROUP I. Cranes, Dragline, Shovels, Skimmer Scoops, Clamshells or Derrick Boats, Pile Drivers, Crane-Type Backhoes, Asphalt Plant

Operators, Concrete Plant Operators, Dredges, Asphalt Spreading Machines, All Locomotives, Cable Ways or Tower Machines, Hoists, Hydraulic Backhoes, Ditching Machines or Backfiller, Cherrypickers, Overhead Cranes, Roller - Steam or Gas, Concrete Pavers, Excavators, Concrete Breakers, Concrete Pumps, Bulk Cement Plants, Cement Pumps, Derrick-Type Drills, Boat Operators, Motor Graders or Pushcats, Scoops or Tournapulls, Bulldozers, Endloaders or Fork Lifts, Power Blade or Elevating Graders, Winch Cats, Boom or Winch Trucks or Boom Tractors, Pipe Wrapping or Painting Machines, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Journeyman Lubricating Engineer, Drills (other than Derrick Type), Mud Jacks, or Well Drilling Machines, Boring Machines or Track Jacks, Mixers, Conveyors (Two), Air Compressors (Two), Water Pumps regardless of size (Two), Welding Machines (Two), Siphons or Jets (Two), Winch Heads or Apparatuses (Two), Light Plants (Two), All Tractors regardless of size (straight tractor only), Fireman on Stationary Boilers, Automatic Elevators, Form Grading Machines, Finishing Machines, Power Sub-Grader or Ribbon Machines, Longitudinal Floats, Distributor Operators on Trucks, Winch Heads or Apparatuses (One), Mobil Track air and heaters (two to five), Heavy Equipment Greaser, Relief Operator, Assistant Master Mechanic and Heavy Duty Mechanic, self-propelled concrete saws of all types and sizes with their attachments, gob-hoppers, excavators all sizes, the repair and greasing of all diesel hammers, the operation and set-up of bidwells, water blasters of all sizes and their clutches, hydraulic jacks where used for hoisting, operation of log skidders, iceolators used on and off of pipeline, condor cranes, bow boats, survey boats, bobcats and all their attachments, skid steer loaders and all their attachments, creter cranes, batch plants, operator (all sizes), self propelled roto mills, operation of conveyor systems of any size and any configuration, operation, repair and service of all vibratory hammers, all power pacs and their controls regardless of location, curtains or brush burning machines, stump cutter machines, Nail launchers when mounted on a machine or self-propelled, operation of con-cover machines, and all Operators except those listed below).

GROUP II. Assistant Operators.

GROUP III. Air Compressors (One), Water Pumps, regardless of Size (One), Waterblasters (one), Welding Machine (One), Mixers (One Bag), Conveyor (One), Siphon or Jet (One), Light Plant (One), Heater (One), Immobile Track Air (One), and Self Propelled Walk-Behind Rollers.

GROUP IV. Asphalt Spreader Oilers, Fireman on Whirlies and Heavy Equipment Oilers, Truck Cranes, Dredges, Monigans, Large Cranes - (Over 65-ton rated capacity) Concrete Plant Oiler, Blacktop Plant Oiler, and Creter Crane Oiler (when required).

GROUP V. Oiler.

GROUP VI. Operators on equipment with Booms, including jibs, 100 feet and over, and less than 150 feet long.

GROUP VII. Operators on equipment with Booms, including jibs, 150 feet and over, and less than 200 feet long.

GROUP VIII. Operators on Equipment with Booms, including jibs, 200 feet and over; Tower Cranes; and Whirlie Cranes.

GROUP IX. Master Mechanic

OPERATING ENGINEERS - Highway

GROUP I. Cranes, Dragline, Shovels, Skimmer Scoops, Clamshells or Derrick Boats, Pile Drivers, Crane-Type Backhoes, Asphalt Plant Operators, Concrete Plant Operators, Dredges, Asphalt Spreading Machines, All Locomotives, Cable Ways or Tower Machines, Hoists, Hydraulic Backhoes, Ditching Machines or Backfiller, Cherrypickers, Overhead Cranes, Roller - Steam or Gas, Concrete Pavers, Excavators, Concrete Breakers, Concrete Pumps, Bulk Cement Plants, Cement Pumps, Derrick-Type Drills, Boat Operators, Motor Graders or Pushcats, Scoops or Tournapulls, Bulldozers, Endloaders or Fork Lifts, Power Blade or Elevating Graders, Winch Cats, Boom or Winch Trucks or Boom Tractors, Pipe Wrapping or Painting Machines, Asphalt Plant Engineer, Journeyman Lubricating Engineer, Drills (other than Derrick Type), Mud Jacks, Well Drilling Machines, Boring Machines, Track Jacks, Mixers, Conveyors (Two), Air Compressors (Two), Water Pumps regardless of size (Two), Welding Machines (Two), Siphons or Jets (Two), Winch Heads or Apparatuses (Two), Light Plants (Two), All Tractors regardless of size (straight tractor only), Fireman on Stationary Boilers, Automatic Elevators, Form Grading Machines, Finishing Machines, Power Sub-Grader or Ribbon Machines, Longitudinal Floats, Distributor Operators on

Trucks, Winch Heads or Apparatuses (One), Mobil Track air and heaters (two to five), Heavy Equipment Greaser, Relief Operator, Assistant Master Mechanic and Heavy Duty Mechanic, self-propelled concrete saws of all types and sizes with their attachments, gob-hoppers, excavators all sizes, the repair and greasing of all diesel hammers, the operation and set-up of bidwells, water blasters of all sizes and their clutches, hydraulic jacks where used for hoisting, operation of log skidders, iceolators used on and off of pipeline, condor cranes, bow boats, survey boats, bobcats and all their attachments, skid steer loaders and all their attachments, creter cranes, batch plants, operator (all sizes), self propelled roto mills, operation of conveyor systems of any size and any configuration, operation, repair and service of all vibratory hammers, all power pacs and their controls regardless of location, curtains or brush burning machines, stump cutter machines, Nail launchers when mounted on a machine or self-propelled, operation of con-cover machines, and all Operators (except those listed below).

GROUP II. Assistant Operators.

GROUP III. Air Compressors (One), Water Pumps, regardless of Size (One), Waterblasters (one), Welding Machine (One), Mixers (One Bag), Conveyor (One), Siphon or Jet (One), Light Plant (One), Heater (One), Immobile Track Air (One), and Self Propelled Walk-Behind Rollers.

GROUP IV. Asphalt Spreader Oilers, Fireman on Whirlies and Heavy Equipment Oilers, Truck Cranes, Dredges, Monigans, Large Cranes - (Over 65-ton rated capacity) Concrete Plant Oiler, Blacktop Plant Oiler, and Creter Crane Oiler (when required).

GROUP V. Oiler.

GROUP VI. Operators on equipment with Booms, including jibs, 100 feet and over, and less than 150 feet long.

GROUP VII. Operators on equipment with Booms, including jibs, 150 feet and over, and less than 200 feet long.

GROUP VIII. Operators on Equipment with Booms, including jibs, 200 feet and over; Tower Cranes; and Whirlie Cranes.

GROUP IX. Mechanic

SURVEY WORKER - Operated survey equipment including data collectors, G.P.S. and robotic instruments, as well as conventional levels and transits.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working forepersons, and dispatchers. Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - OIL AND CHIP RESEALING ONLY.

This shall encompass laborers, workers and mechanics who drive contractor or subcontractor owned, leased, or hired pickup, dump, service, or oil distributor trucks. The work includes transporting materials and equipment (including but not limited to, oils, aggregate supplies, parts, machinery and tools) to or from the job site; distributing oil or liquid asphalt and aggregate; stock piling material when in connection with the actual oil and chip contract. The Truck Driver (Oil & Chip Resealing) wage classification does not include supplier delivered materials.

## TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of all materials used for Mosaic and Terrazzo work including preparing, mixing by hand, by mixing machine or transporting of pre-mixed materials and distributing with shovel, rake, hoe, or pail, all kinds of concrete foundations necessary for Mosaic and Terrazzo work, all cement terrazzo, magnesite terrazzo, Do-O-Tex terrazzo, epoxy matrix ter-razzo, exposed aggregate, rustic or rough washed for exterior or interior of buildings placed either by machine or by hand, and any other kind of mixture of plastics composed of chips or granules when mixed with cement, rubber, neoprene, vinyl, magnesium chloride or any other resinous or chemical substances used for seamless flooring systems, and all other building materials, all similar materials and all precast terrazzo work on jobs, all scratch coat used for Mosaic and Terrazzo work and sub-bed, tar paper and wire mesh (2x2 etc.) or lath. The rubbing, grinding, cleaning and finishing of same either by hand or by machine or by terrazzo resurfacing equipment on new or existing floors. When necessary finishers shall be allowed to assist the mechanics to spread sand bed, lay tarpaper and wire mesh (2x2 etc.) or lath. The finishing of cement floors where additional aggregate of stone is added by spreading or sprinkling on top of the finished base, and troweled or rolled into the finish and then the surface is ground by grinding machines.

## Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

## LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
