MAYOR'S MESSAGE

2016 welcomes spring with much excitement and positive momentum! As you look throughout Belleville, you will notice a significant amount of projects, growth and new businesses.

There are a number of areas that will see sidewalk and road improvements in our city this year. Our North Illinois Streetscape continues to make progress throughout this past winter and promises to be complete by the end of this year. The second phase of Juanita Place will soon begin.

Construction is well underway at the Missionary Ventures, LLC project located near the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows on IL Rt. 15. Over 400,000 cubic yards of dirt have been moved at the development site. The foundation is set for Hofbräuhaus St. Louis-Belleville and the walls are being built. The sewer and other utilities are also being installed. The 1.5 million dollars of brewing equipment for this German restaurant and brewery has shipped from Vienna, Austria. This amazing development continues to move forward!

The City Council approved the development of a new business district at 6401 West Main Street, formally the \$20 Shoe Outlet. Stay tuned for a new possible development!

It is very evident that sewer upgrades continue throughout the city. The City is presently constructing the third phase of its Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) to eliminate combined sewer overflows (CSO's). This is a \$22 million project that will eliminate four CSO's that stretch along Richland Creek from South 6th Street and West Main to West Monroe Street. A pump station is being constructed at West Monroe Street and 4th Street that will pump combined sewage to the treatment plant. All the pipe for collection and transport of this water is also under construction along this route.

The fourth phase of the LTCP is being engineered at this time. This project will relieve two more CSO's at North 23rd Street and 9th and E Streets. A pump station and associated pipe will be installed starting sometime in 2017.

There are several Inflow and Infiltration (I&I) projects being engineered to relieve sewer surcharging in the East Creek watershed. The first phase of this project was recently completed with construction of the Muren Street relief pump station and Hecker Street storage tank. This project has solved many sewage back-ups into homes in the area as well as reduced

the environmental impact of surcharged sanitary sewers.

Construction has started to provide sewer service to the Missionary Ventures Project that will serve Hofbräuhaus St. Louis-Belleville. This is scheduled for completion this summer.

Finally, plans are complete for a storm water project to relieve flooding issues on South 29th Street. This project could be constructed this year.

Our new police station, located at 720 West Main Street, is still on track to open in early summer. Renovations of City Hall, including building and parking lot improvements, are expected to begin in June and end by January 2017. At the City Council meeting held on February 1, 2016, the City Council approved plans for temporary relocation of administration offices and city meetings during the renovation of City Hall. Details of these changes are explained in this edition of the city newsletter.

In closing, I hope you will join us for our many wonderful festivals and events planned for the spring and summer seasons including, Art on the Square, ranked the #1 Art Show in the Nation for 2016, Belleville Ale Fest, Old Town Market, Outdoor Summer Concerts, Memorial Day, Shrine Circus Parade, Wine, Dine & Jazz and many others listed in our city newsletter. Enjoy all that Belleville has to offer!

RENOVATIONS CALL FOR TEMPORARY OFFICE AND MEETING RELOCATIONS

OFFICE RELOCATIONS

Belleville's City Hall will soon be undergoing renovations. After the relocation of the Police Department from City Hall to its new location at 720 W. Main Street in early summer, City Hall will begin a much-needed renovation.

Built in 1957, the current City Hall at 101 S. Illinois St., was designed by architect Charles King. This sturdy building with its terrazzo floors, large windows, and high ceilings has served the public well, but asbestos abatement and compliance with ADA requirements are important changes that are long overdue.

Renovations are expected to begin in June and end in early 2017. While these renovations are taking place, all offices and meeting rooms currently within City Hall will temporarily relocate as indicated below. Phone numbers, mailing addresses, and emails will not change during the temporary relocation.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding during the next few months. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience during this renovation, but feel that the renovations will help us better serve our businesses and residents in the years ahead.

BELLEVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

The Belleville Historic Preservation Commission is a board of members appointed by the City that is responsible for administering the provisions of the Historic District Ordinance. Its purpose is the enhancement and perpetuation of Belleville's historic neighborhoods and landmark buildings. In support of that purpose, the Commission is empowered to review and approve or disapprove changes to the exteriors of homes in the Historic Districts.

The City of Belleville's Design Guideline/Policy and Procedures Manual is a comprehensive reference volume that is designed to provide a guide to building design, material utilization and preservation objectives in the city's Old Belleville, Hexenbuckel, and Oakland historic districts.

An important section of the manual consists of a guide to the design review process, which is required for exterior revisions to buildings located in the city's three locally designated historic districts. Copies of the Design Manual are available for reference purposes at Belleville City Hall, the city's Health, Housing, & Building Department at 407 East Lincoln Street, and at the main Public Library downtown. The manual is also available online on the city's website at belleville.net/hpc.

SUMMER DAY CAMPS ABOUND IN BELLEVILLE






