Mayor Mark Eckert called this meeting to order.

Mayor Eckert explained the disaster procedures. Mayor Eckert reminded anyone speaking this evening to step up to a microphone because the meetings are being taped and posted the next day on the website.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

**Lillian Schneider**

Ms. Schneider stated her comments are to the aldermen and when they are at committee meetings they should not act like children. At the last Economic Development meeting, the night before the press conference, the question was asked “is Lillian invited?”. and say congratulations when they do name the hotels if it does happen. Regarding the new project, the public has a right to know what is going in there since the sales tax on things that are bought. The city has the largest sales tax around and if you care about your constituents vote no on this project until we know who and what it is.

**Hal Inabinet**

Mr. Inabinet stated he has extreme disappointment since it has been a year now since the Shrine has been approved and there is still not a hotel. There is money being spent for sewer lines. We need to hold the developer accountable since they are holding the city hostage. Mr. Inabinet stated he was told this had to be approved or it will go somewhere else. The change order for Gonzales is in the amount of \$36,000 for Missionary Ventures. Change orders cost the taxpayers' money. He would like to know the details of why. He read they rerouted it...who didn't figure this out to start with? He requested details on whose fault for the change order i.e. is it the city's fault with no direction from the engineer or the contracted engineer who drew it up to start with.

Concerning Big Daddy's wants to close two blocks...why should a private enterprise that is there to make money for the block party close a private street that belongs to the taxpayers. That is favoring a business. There are twelve Saturdays that the streets are closed downtown. That is 25% of the weekends.

**FIRST AMENDMENT TO  
DISPOSAL AGREEMENT**

This First Amendment to the Disposal Agreement (the "First Amendment") is entered into on **March 16, 2016** by and between **Waste Management of Illinois, Inc.** ("Contractor") and the **City of Belleville, Illinois** ("City").

**Recitals**

- A. The City and Contractor entered into a Service Agreement on or about November 7, 2005 (the "Agreement"); and,
- B. The City and Contractor desire to extend the term of the Agreement on a month-to-month basis, as further discussed below, while they negotiate a new, long-term disposal agreement in good faith.

**Agreement**

The parties agree to amend the Agreement in the following manner:

1) Starting on April 1, 2016, the Agreement shall automatically renew for successive one-month renewal terms until (a) either Party provides the other Party with at least 30-days advance written notice of termination; or (b) the Parties enter into a new, long-term disposal agreement that supersedes the Agreement. During the renewal terms, the per ton fee shall remain at \$42.69 for Milam and \$35.25 for Cottonwood and shall remain subject to Sections 4(c) and 4(d).

2) Except as modified herein, the terms and conditions of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

The parties have caused this First Amendment to be executed by their duly authorized representatives effective as of the day and year first above written.

#### 4. Term and Disposal Fees.

a. This Agreement shall commence on April 1, 2006 and will continue through March 31, 2016. The per ton disposal fee for 13,000 tons of Solid Waste per year or more shall be as set forth below:

b. The above price per ton will be escalated by 10% in any given year (April-March) that the City does not deliver 13,000 tons of solid waste. Any additional amount due as a result will be paid on or before April 30.

c. The above per ton fees include all current State and County fees. Any new fees or increases to existing fees will be added to the above per ton fees.

d. The Contractor will provide the City with a monthly invoice indicating the tonnage of City Waste received from the City during the preceding month. The City shall pay each invoice within 30 days of receipt. The Contractor shall retain all relevant weight records for a period of two years after waste has been received and disposed of. These weight records will be made available to the City upon request.

5. Compliance With Laws. The Contractor will comply with all applicable laws and regulations in connection with the disposal of City Waste under the terms of this Agreement.

6. Indemnification. The Contractor agrees to indemnify, save harmless and defend the City, its elected officials, employees and agents from and against any claim arising in whole or in part as a result of any negligent or willful act or omission of Contractor, its employees or subcontractors in the performance of this Agreement. The Contractor also agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City, its elected officials, employees and agents from all liability (including attorneys' fees) for removal or remedial actions under the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act of 1980, as amended, or comparable state law incurred at the Facilities as a result of providing services under this Agreement.

7. Excused Non-Performance. The performance of this Agreement may be suspended by either party in the event the transportation of City Waste or disposal of City Waste are prevented by a cause or causes beyond the reasonable control of such party. Such causes shall include, but not be limited to acts of God, acts of war, riot, fire, explosion, accident, flood or sabotage; lack of adequate fuel, power, raw materials, labor or transportation facilities; governmental laws, regulations, requirements, orders or actions; breakage or failure of machinery or apparatus; national defense requirements; injunctions or restraining orders; labor trouble and strike. The party asserting a right to suspend performance under this section must, within a reasonable time after it has knowledge of the effective cause, notify the other party of the cause for suspension. The party asserting a right to suspend performance hereunder shall advise the other party when the suspending event has ended, and when performance will be resumed. Once the suspending event ends, the party which has suspended performance will promptly resume performance.

## 8. General Provisions

a. Binding Effect. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors, assignees and

legal representatives. In the event the City discontinues to collect City Waste and franchises or otherwise contracts with a third party for such collection, the City will advise such third party that it will be obligated to dispose of all City Waste it collects under the terms of this Agreement and will impose a contractual duty on such third party to do so. In the event the Contractor sells or otherwise transfers any of the Facilities to a third party, the Contractor will advise such third party that it will be obligated to accept for disposal all City Waste delivered under the terms of this Agreement and will impose a contractual duty on such third party to do so.

b. Transfer Station. Both the City and Contractor agree in the event a Waste Transfer Station is planned within the Corporate City Limits of Belleville, the Contractor shall have the right of first refusal to any contracted permitting, construction, operation and management services that the City may require.

c. Authority. Both the City and the Contractor represent that they have the requisite power, authority and legal right to enter into and perform their respective obligations hereunder.

d. Severability. In the event that any provision of this Agreement shall for any reason, be determined to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, the other provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

e. Entire Agreement. This agreement shall constitute the entire Agreement between the City and the Contractor with respect to the disposal services contemplated herein.

## DISPOSAL AGREEMENT

This Disposal Agreement (the "Agreement") made and entered into on this 7<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2005, by and between Waste Management of Illinois, Inc. ("Contractor") and the City of Belleville, Illinois ("City").

### Recitals

WHEREAS, the City picks up and hauls approximately 13,000 tons per year of residential solid waste and yard waste generated within its boundaries and is responsible for disposing such waste;

WHEREAS, the Contractor currently owns and operates two solid waste disposal facilities (the Milam Recycling and Disposal Facility located in Fairmont City, Illinois and the Cottonwood Hills Recycling and Disposal Facility located in Marissa, Illinois capable of disposing of the waste picked up and hauled by the City(Facilities)

WHEREAS, the City and Contractor desire to enter into an agreement whereby the city will deliver, or cause to be delivered, residential solid waste to the Facilities and the Contractor will dispose of such residential solid waste and yard waste in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual obligations undertaken herein, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Waste Materials. The waste materials to be disposed of pursuant to this Agreement will be all solid waste this is collected by the City from City residents ("City Waste"). City Waste shall not include any regulated quantities of hazardous, infectious, special or radioactive wastes as defined by applicable law. Yard waste, at the City's option, may also be disposed of at the facility.

2. Transportation of Waste Materials. The City shall deliver all City Waste that it collects from City residents to one of the Facilities. The Contractor shall have no obligations with respect to the transportation and delivery of City Waste.

3. Disposal of Waste Materials and Reservation of Capacity. The Contractor shall be responsible for accepting and properly disposing of all City Waste delivered by the City pursuant to this Agreement. The City will use the Facilities as its exclusive disposal outlets for City Waste, and the Contractor will reserve capacity at at least one of the Facilities to insure that the City has adequate disposal capacity during the term hereof.
