The second half of 2016 is an exciting time in Belleville's history! Our new Belleville Police Station, located at 720 West Main Street, is a beautiful state-of-the-art facility that our police department will call home for many years to come. By the first of July, City Hall will be empty so that renovations can begin on our 60 year old facility. These renovations will include asbestos abatement and ADA required building and parking lot improvements. Safety and security upgrades will also be installed. It is our hope that all city offices will return to City Hall by mid January 2017. Thank you in advance for your cooperation during these moves and adjustments.

I extend my sincere appreciation to Patty Gregory and the Art on the Square Committee for another fabulous art show this past May. This was the 15th consecutive year for this wonderful event, following last year's show that was named the #1 Art Show in the Nation!

The Missionary Ventures, LLC project located near the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows on IL Rt. 15 is progressing and Hofbrauhaus St. Louis-Belleville is really taking shape! To date,

5.4 million dollars has been expended project wide.

Several sidewalk and road improvements will continue throughout the summer. Our North Illinois Streetscape project is currently in progress and ahead of schedule. Belle Avenue is currently under construction and will be completed by the end of July. Roland Avenue improvements will begin soon and are also expected to be completed by the end of July. The

second phase of Juanita Place will be finished by late fall. The Dutch Hollow Bridge construction will begin by November and will be completed by June 2017.

At our recent Memorial Day ceremony, one of our outstanding youth, Neil Wegrzyn, unveiled his Eagle Scout project at Walnut Hill Cemetery; a tribute to the local heroes from the Vietnam War. Be sure to visit this wonderful memorial located at 1101 Mascoutah Ave.

Great things continue to happen in Belleville, thanks to the many citizens, businesses and organizations that continue to support our city! Thank you, and have a safe summer!

CITY FIREWORKS REGULATIONS

The City's Offenses Ordinance, Chapter 30, Section 1-15 Fireworks, prohibits the possession, use, display, ignition, sale, or offer to sell, of any fireworks including, firecrackers, torpedoes, Roman candles, sky rockets, or other pyrotechnics within the City.

The use of novelties such as sparklers, snakes, and snap-n-pops are allowed in Belleville at all times and can be sold everywhere, except gas stations, due to the dispensing of flammable liquids.

Professional 1.3 Pyrotechnics Fireworks require a city permit and the approval of the city's Fire Chief and an extensive permit and registration with the Illinois State Fire Marshal and the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives.

TEMPORARY OFFICE RELOCATIONS

Belleville's City Hall will soon be undergoing renovations. After the relocation of the Police Department from City Hall to its new location at 720 West Main Street at the end of June, renovations will begin.

Built in 1957, the current City Hall at 101 S. Illinois St. was designed by architect Charles King. This sturdy building with its terrazzo floors, large windows, and high ceilings has served the public well, but asbestos abatement and compliance with ADA requirements are important changes that are long overdue.

Renovations are expected to begin in July of 2016 and end in early 2017. While these renovations are taking place, all offices currently within City Hall will temporarily relocate as indicated below. Phone numbers, mailing addresses, and emails will not change during the temporary relocation.

Thank you for your cooperation and understanding during the next few months. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience during this renovation, but feel that the renovations will help us better serve our businesses and residents in the years ahead.

THINKING OF TOPPING YOUR TREES?

Tree topping is often done because the landowner believes the tree has grown too large and is a danger. Here are eight reasons why NOT to top your trees:

- 1. Starvation:** Topping removes the leafy crown which reduces the ability of the tree to produce food.
- 2. Shock:** By removing the tree canopy, you are exposing the bark to direct sunlight which can cause scalding and lead to tree death.
- 3. Insects and Disease:** The exposed ends of topped limbs are vulnerable to insect invasion and decay.
- 4. Weak Limbs:** New branches growing from the stubbed limb are weakly attached and more liable to break from snow or ice.
- 5. Rapid New Growth:** New branches are

more numerous and often grow higher than before the tree was topped, which is opposite of the desired effect.

- 6. Tree Death:** Some tree species cannot tolerate major branch loss. They become weak and disease prone which could lead to death.
- 7. Ugliness:** A topped tree is a disfigured tree. Even with new growth, it never regains the character and grace of its species.
- 8. Cost:** The true cost of topping is often hidden. It can lead to lower property values, expense of removal, and replacement if the tree dies.

For proper pruning techniques, please consult a certified arborist. If you feel your tree is getting too large for its location, crown reduction can be done to



NEWS ON THE STREET - OIL & CHIP OPERATIONS

The Street Department will conduct Oil & Chip Operations starting August 15 and ending approximately August 19, utilizing IDOT approved emulsion and chips. Streets scheduled for Oil & Chip Operations are those in the area west of Rt. 159 (Illinois Street) and east of North 28th Street, including side streets on both sides of West Main Street.

Motorists are asked to observe traffic control signs and flag personnel. Cars should be removed

from the streets by 7:00 am. Signs are generally posted prior to the oiling & chipping, however, the exact day for a particular street cannot be determined. Emulsion curing time is dependent upon air temperature and humidity, but usually takes 45 minutes to 1 hour. After emulsion is applied, chips are spread. Motorists are asked not to drive over fresh emulsion, and to exercise caution on the freshly chipped streets.

CURFEW REGULATIONS

The City of Belleville's curfew ordinance is applicable to children under seventeen (17) years of age. The City's objectives are to reduce and protect juveniles from violence, gang activity, and crime, and to further strengthen parental responsibility for children without unduly infringing upon the constitutional rights of parents to direct their children's upbringing.

Curfew Hours for person(s) less than fifteen (15) years of age:

- Between 10 PM Friday and 6 AM Saturday,
- Between 10 PM Saturday and 6 AM

Sunday, and

- Between 9 PM on Sunday through Thursday, inclusive, and 6 AM on the following day.

Curfew Hours for person(s) less than seventeen (17) years of age:

- Between 11 PM Friday and 6 AM Saturday,
- Between 11 PM Saturday and 6 AM Sunday, and
- Between 10 PM on Sunday through Thursday, inclusive, and 6 AM on the following day.

A minor commits an offense if he or

she remains in any public place or on the premises of any establishment during curfew hours. A parent or guardian of a minor or other person in custody or control of a minor commits an offense if he or she knowingly permits the minor to remain in any public place or on the premises of any establishment during curfew hours. The penalty for an offense is \$250. The penalty for any subsequent offenses is \$500.


