Mayor Eckert called this meeting to order.

Mayor Eckert explained the disaster procedures. Mayor Eckert reminded anyone speaking this evening to step up to a microphone because the meetings are being taped and posted the next day on the website.

Members excused on roll call: Phil Elmore and James Musgrove.

## **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

### **Michael Hagberg**

Reminder: the yearly deadline for closing inactive TIFs is quickly approaching. At last year's TIF review meetings, it was mentioned a couple of TIFs should be closed because of inactivity and the deadline was missed.

The agenda has an item on 15C that reads "Ordinance 7964 - an ordinance amending Ordinance 7955". The Opens Meetings Act requires that agendas list items with sufficient information provided to the public about the action before the council makes a vote. With no additional provided in the packet he believes this is a violation of the Opens Meeting Act.

Back in December, Mayor Eckert stated that the taxes on a \$100,000 home would increase by approximately \$8.71. In April, they learned the actual increase is \$70.20. Mayor Eckert then said a substantial amount of this increase was due to the governor's signing into law property tax exemptions for disabled veterans. He submitted a FOIA to the county and received a list of all properties within Belleville that have received disabled veterans exemptions. Having analyzed the data he has calculated the effect of disabled veterans exemption to be \$9.44 of the \$70.20 increase. Mayor Eckert, \$9.44 is not a substantial amount of the property tax increase.

### **Stewart Lannert**

He sees they are going to buy police cars and he thought the object was to buy local. As far as the Shrine project he stated when Belleville wants to do anything i.e. parking spaces they have to get an engineering study or impact study. Did anyone do a study to figure how many people might come to the Shrine (German Munic Beer Hall) styled after Adolph Hilter's beer hall and four of five hotels and restaurants.

He is in favor of firing Chief Clay...he has no flags on the police cars. He feels this is totally un-American and a bad policy. There is a total breakdown of law and order in the city. He has tried to talk to the Mayor and Chief Clay and was totally ignored. He filed a complaint against Chief Clay about eight years ago and in less than four hours Chief Clay personally called and told him he was a liar and trouble maker.

Cars are running the stop sign at 29th and Godfrey all day and night.

**Rose Wilson**

Adolph Hilter era has nothing to do with the Hofbräuhaus.

**Mary Fischer**

She stated since she has been back for a visit the city is progressing. She lived in the city 49 years and most of that she has seen under Mayor Eckert. She sees a lot of negative things in the newspaper and we live in a country where everyone can speak their mind. She stated Lindenwood has made a difference; it would have been an empty building with windows broken out, the business next to the duplexes is gone. She thinks the city and the people behind running it are doing the best job she has ever seen.

**Mayor Eckert Response to Comments**

The city's police cars are advertised to local dealers; however, they are purchased out of town because they have the state bid package which saves the tax payer an enormous amount of money plus the local dealers will not bid.

He will have an answer regarding the veterans disability and because he believes Mr. Hagberg's comments are not on track.

The open house for the police department will be on June 25, 2016 from 10:00 am - 4:00 pm.

Mayor,

The Police Department has been approved to apply for the 2016 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program. The solicitation for funding from this grant has several components that must be met in a timely manner. One of which is a public hearing which must be held within 30 days of the deadline for submission of the application. The deadline mentioned is June 30, 2016. I ask that a public hearing be held on June 27, 2016. The following information will explain the grant funding and its expected use.

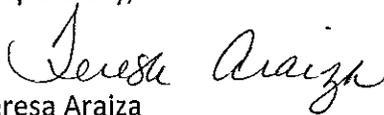
The grant allocation for St. Clair County is One Hundred Eighteen Thousand Eight Hundred Seventy dollars (\$118,870.00). These funds are divided by an allocation table designated by the US Government. St. Clair County, the City of Belleville and the City of East St. Louis are listed as being in a "disparate grouping" by the US Government and as such must have a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) signed between the units in order to apply for the grant. The funds are distributed based on the allocation table and the agreement between the three agencies. The St. Clair County Sheriff Department agreed to be the administrator of the grant. The Belleville Police Department is allocated Seventeen Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Two dollars (\$17,262.00).

The Police Department would propose the funds to be used to purchase six (6) Tasers and three (3) in-car cameras. The cost of these purchases is estimated to be approximately Twenty Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Four dollars (\$20,334.00). The amount exceeding the grant funds would be taken from the Police Department equipment budget.

I would request that this information be used for the public hearing as required by the grant regulations. If you have any questions in this matter, please feel free to contact me.

BETWEEN THE CITIES OF EAST ST. LOUIS AND BELLEVILLE, AND COUNTY OF  
ST. CLAIR, IL**

**2016 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD**

This Agreement is made and entered into this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June, 2016, by and between the City of East St. Louis, by and through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as and the City of East St. Louis, and the City of Belleville, acting by and through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as City of Belleville, and the County of St. Clair acting by and through its governing body, the County Board, hereinafter referred to as St. Clair County, State of Illinois, witnesseth:

**WHEREAS**, this Agreement is made under the authority of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 22-01 ET SEQ.):

**WHEREAS**, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and

**WHEREAS**, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions under this agreement: and

**WHEREAS**, ALL parties agree to the joint allocation of \$118,870 to divided as follows, East St. Louis shall receive \$71,608, the City of Belleville shall receive \$17,262, and St. Clair County shall receive \$30,000 from the JAG award for the 2016 Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the CITIES and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

**NOW THEREFORE**, the East St. Louis, Belleville, and St. Clair County agree as follows:

**Section 1.**

East St. Louis agrees to use \$71,608\*\*\*\*\*

St. Clair County agrees to use \$30,000\*\*\*\*\*

Belleville agrees to use \$17,262\*\*\*\*\*

**Section 2.**

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against St. Clair County other than claims for which liability may be imposed by any Tort Claims Act.

**Section 3.**

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against Belleville other than claims for which liability may be imposed by any Tort Claims Act.

**Section 4.**

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against East St. Louis other than claims for which liability may be imposed by any Tort Claims Act.

**Section 5.**

Each party to this agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

**Section 6.**

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

**Section 7.**

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

## ORDINANCE7964

### **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 7955, AN ORDINANCE PROPOSING THE APPROVAL OF A BUSINESS DISTRICT PLAN AND DESIGNATION OF A BUSINESS DISTRICT AND FIXING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSALS TO APPROVE A BUSINESS DISTRICT PLAN AND DESIGNATE A BUSINESS DISTRICT**

**WHEREAS**, the Business District Development and Redevelopment Law, 65 ILCS 5/11-74.3 et seq., as amended (the "Law"), states that the corporate authorities of a municipality shall by ordinance propose the approval of a business district plan and designation of a business district and shall fix a time and place for a public hearing on the proposals to approve a business district plan and designate a business district; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City of Bellevilleproposes to create the 6401 West Main Street Marketplace Business District and has placed on file, for public inspection,the "West Main Street Business District, Business DistrictPlan",dated June 6, 2016.

**WHEREAS**, on June 6, 2016, the City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois enacted Ordinance No. 7955, An Ordinance Proposing the Approval of a Business District Plan and Designation of a Business District and Fixing a Time and Place for a Public Hearing on the Proposals to Approve a Business District Plan and Designate a Business District;

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois now desires to amend Ordinance No. 7955 to change the place for such Public Hearing consistent with its scheduled meeting;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois, hereby amends Ordinance No. 7955 to set **Monday, July18, 2016, at 7:00 p.m. atLindenwood University-Alan J. Dixon Bldg., Rear Banquet Hall, 2600 West Main St., Belleville Illinois**,as thetime and place for the Public Hearing on the proposals to approve the "6401 West Main StreetMarketplace Business District, Business District Plan" and designate the 6401 West Main StreetMarketplace Business District.

**SECTION 2:** All other provisions of Ordinance 7955 not amended herein shall remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION 3:** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance. All existing ordinances of the City of Belleville are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 4:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

**ORDINANCE NO. 7965-2016**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 52 (TRAFFIC) OF THE  
REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS  
AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING PORTIONS OF SECTIONS THEREOF**

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

**Section 1.** That **Section 52.201** is hereby amended by adding the following under Schedule "B" thereunder:

**Section 2.** That **Section 52.201** is hereby amended by adding the following under Schedule "D" thereunder:

**SCHEDULE D**

**ONE-WAY STREETS AND ALLEYS**

**DELETE**

West 'E' from Rt. 159 to North 2nd Street

**Section 3.** Any person violating this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties of Chapter 52, Article IX (Penalty).

**Section 4.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, in pamphlet form, all as provided by law.
