Proclamation

Whereas, To facilitate and maintain world peace, cities, their elected officials, and their citizens need to collaborate internationally, through international organizations such as Sister Cities International; and

Whereas, In 2016, Sister Cities International is celebrating 60 years of global citizen and civic diplomatic action, and helping support a future where the world's cities, communities and its citizens can come together in common ground; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International Day is a fitting occasion to commemorate the significant impact that the organization has made in building bridges across nations, cities and communities around the globe in order to create and sustain world peace; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International was founded as a Presidential initiative by President Dwight D. Eisenhower on September 11, 1956 at the White House Conference on citizen diplomacy to create more community-led global relationships so that people of different cultures could appreciate their differences and build partnerships that would lessen the chance of new national conflicts; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International as described by President Eisenhower promotes that fact "that all people want peace. If we are to take advantage of this assumption that all people want peace, then the problem is for people to get together and to leap governments – if necessary to evade governments – to work out not one method but thousands of methods by which people can gradually learn a little bit more of each other."; and

Whereas, Since President Eisenhower, every sitting president has been the Honorary Chairman of Sister Cities International; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International currently has 550 U.S. member cities, counties and states with relationships with over 2100 communities in 145 countries, spanning 6 continents having representation in nearly every district represented in the House of Representatives; and

Whereas, the City of Belleville is proud to be a driving part of this global network with a Sister City partnership with Paderborn, Germany; and

Whereas, The impact of Sister Cities International's programs in 2014 has included participation of 1.13 million. Collectively, in 2014 the SCI network hosted 2316 events and engaged 32,876 volunteers throughout the U.S.; and

Whereas, countless city, county, and state governments and their leaders have been involved in global relationships due to Sister Cities International and; and

Whereas, these relationships include educational, economic, cultural, municipal and humanitarian assistance exchange programs that are mutually beneficial to each community; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International Day is a call to action for Americans and citizens of the world to come together to celebrate the importance of communities' continued commitment to supporting to a more peaceful and prosperous future through continued people to people exchanges; and

Whereas, Sister Cities International Day is an opportune time for Americans and the world to come together and show how powerful humanity can be when we unite to promote peace, progress and prosperity for a better world.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Mark W. Eckert, Mayor of the City of Belleville, Illinois, do hereby proclaim July 15, 2016 as Sister Cities International Day in the City of Belleville.

2016 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program.

Sean Harris, Department Administrator, stated they applied for the JAG Grant annually and is broken into three agencies i.e. St. Clair County Sheriff's Department, City of Belleville and the City of East St. Louis. This year the City of Belleville was allocated \$17,262.00 and the funds will be used for six (6) tasers and three (3) in-car recording vehicle camera systems.

Discussion...

Alderman Silsby stated since it involves three agencies is the money divided equally; Harris stated the agency that administers the grant receives \$30,000 and the rest is divided which is dictated by the federal government.

Alderman Elmore asked how many tasers does the police department currently have; Harris stated approximately 70 and there is a new federal guideline that stated "all officers on the agency must be issued and keep a taser on their person, including the chief". Alderman Elmore asked how many in-car cameras does the police department currently have; Harris stated approximately 20-30; however, the force has 20 squad cars and each car that is assigned to patrol has one.

Action Requested: Barry Hayden of Hayden Properties is requesting a recommendation by the Planning Commission regarding the above-referenced Site Plan

Property Description: The subject site, St. Clair County Parcel # 09-19.0-200-006, is an approximately 93.4-acre parcel located on the north side of Green Mount Road, immediately east of the MetroLink tracks. The subject parcel is 20 acres of this overall property. It is zoned C-4 Commercial District and a Special Use Permit was obtained by the applicant to facilitate multi-family housing on the site. It is currently vacant and has been used in the past for agricultural uses.


Access:

There is currently access to the site via an existing road on its western boundary, however, the Applicant proposes to provide a full access to the site from Illinois Route 161/Carlyle Avenue.

**Surrounding
Zoning & Land**

Uses:

To the North is additional agriculturally used property which is located in the Village of Shiloh. To the East and West are other C-4 Commercial -zoned properties, including the East Belleville YMCA. To the South is agriculturally used property located in



**Comprehensive
Plan:**

The Future Land Use Map calls for this area to be used for general residential uses.

Analysis:

The Applicant proposes to build a total of 22 16-unit multi-family buildings, for a total of 352 apartments. There will be a mixture of one and two bedroom apartments on the site. The proposed materials for the apartment complex will be presented to the Commission at the meeting.

Parking criteria for multi-family development, as outlined in the Zoning Code, is dependent upon the number of bedrooms proposed. Rather than utilizing the criteria both the one or less and the two or more bedrooms, the Applicant proposes to park the development at the higher standard of 2/spaces per a dwelling unit. This results in 704 required parking spaces. The Applicant has provided 718. There are no buffering requirements for the site, however City of Belleville Code requires that landscaping be provided for parking lots with twenty (20) or more parking spaces. In these instances, five percent (5%) of the total parking lot area must be landscaped. The landscape plan provided shows grassed areas with trees and shrubs.

Staff

Recommendation: Staff recommends approval of the Site Plan with the suggestion that additional landscaping be added.

Voting Options: The Planning Commission has the following options when considering a Site Plan application:

- Recommend approval as submitted
- Recommend approval with additional conditions



ORDINANCE NO. 7966-2016

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 30 (OFFENSES), SECTION 30-1-44 (TRUANCY) OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING PORTIONS OF SECTIONS THEREOF

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That **Section 31-1-1** is hereby amended by replacing Subsection (T) thereof with the following:

30-1-44 TRUANCY.

(A) **Truancy Defined.** A "truant" is defined as a child subject to compulsory school attendance and who is absent without valid cause from such attendance for a school day or portion thereof.

"Valid cause" for absence shall be illness, observance of a religious holiday, death in the immediate family, family emergency, and shall include such other situations beyond the control of the student as determined by the board of education in each district, or such other circumstances which cause reasonable concern to the parent for the safety or health of the student.

"Chronic or habitual truant" shall be defined as a child subject to compulsory school attendance and who is absent without valid cause from such attendance for ~~ten~~ **five** percent (~~10~~ **5**%) or more of the previous **one hundred eighty (180)** regular attendance days.

"Truant minor" is defined as a chronic truant to whom supportive services, including prevention, diagnostic intervention and remedial services, alternative programs and other school and community resources have been provided and have failed to result in the cessation of chronic truancy, or have been offered and refused.

A "dropout" is defined as any child enrolled in grades 1 through 12 whose name has been removed from the district enrollment roster for any reason other than his death, extended illness, graduation or completion of a program of studies and who has not transferred to another public or private school.

“Religion” for the purposes of this Article, includes all aspects of religious observance and practice, as well as belief.

(B) **Truancy Prohibited.** It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of **eighteen (18)** enrolled in a public, private or parochial school, to absent himself or herself from attendance at school without parental permission. Any person who shall so absent himself or herself shall be guilty of the offense of truancy and be subject to a fine not to exceed **One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)** for each offense. Emergency or unforeseen absences due to illness or other causes beyond the control of the person so absenting himself or herself from school without parental permission shall not constitute truancy if permission is submitted in writing to the proper school authorities within **twenty-four (24) hours** after such absence. It is unlawful for any parent, custodian or guardian of a minor to knowingly permit, by insufficient control, to allow the minor to be present in any public places or on the premises of any establishment within the City during which the minor is absent himself or herself from attendance of school without parental permission and shall be subject to a fine not to exceed **One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00)** for each offense. **(Ord. No. 7504; 07-05-11)**

(C) **False Excuse Prohibited.** It shall be an offense under this Section for a parent or person in loco parentis to knowingly submit to the proper school authorities a written excuse under paragraph (B) that contains false information. A person convicted of an offense under this Section shall be subject to a fine of not more than **Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)** for each offense.

(D) **Permission Parameters.** Parental permission shall include permission from a person in loco parentis, and shall be given for reasons only of personal illness, serious family illness, death in the family, serious home emergencies, necessary and lawful family support employment, religious convocation classes, Principal's permission and compelling family reasons. **(Ord. No. 5427; 05-15-95) (Sec. 61.43)**

Section 2. That conflicting Ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force the time this takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties of Chapter 30, Section 30-1-44.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, in pamphlet, all as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 7967-2016

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 60 (ZONING CODE), SECTION 60-7-11 (OUTDOOR RESTAURANTS AND DINING ESTABLISHMENTS) OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS, AS AMENDED

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That **Section 60-7-11** is hereby amended as follows:

60-7-11 OUTDOOR RESTAURANTS AND DINING ESTABLISHMENTS.

(A) Outdoor restaurants and dining establishments as defined shall be permitted as a "Special Use" in the Zoning Districts as specified.

(B) The following regulations and requirements must be complied with before a "business license" as required by the City can be issued:

(1) Tables and seating shall be portable and must be ~~removed-secured~~ at the end of each business day. The outdoor seating area shall be permitted only during the normal hours of operation of the restaurant.

(2) Placement of tables, seating and equipment shall be restricted to the front of the business and contiguous property and shall not obstruct or impede pedestrian traffic. An unobstructed walkway ~~of at least five (5) feet wide in conformance with the U.S. Access Board's Public Right-of-Way Accessibility Guidelines~~ shall be maintained at all times.

(3) No signs or other graphics shall be displayed other than what is permitted under the Street Graphics/Sign Code Ordinance; provided, however, that this subsection (3) shall not apply to table umbrellas containing graphics.

~~(4) The outside installation and use of a television and/or other video equipment shall be permitted only with the prior written approval of the Zoning Administrator.~~

~~(5) The outside installation and use of floral or other temporary decorative pieces on City property shall be permitted only with the prior written approval of the Zoning Administrator.~~

(46) Provisions shall be made for adequate litter and trash control including providing for and maintaining of trash receptacles. The outdoor seating area shall be kept clean and free of debris at all times.

(57) The seating shall not obstruct any entryway or exit of the building or adjacent building(s).

(68) Alcoholic beverages shall only be permitted to be served or consumed in the designated outdoor seating area in accordance with the Outdoor Areas provisions in Section 21 -1-14(A) of the Liquor Code (Location, Outdoor Areas).

(79) The business shall maintain liability insurance in the required amounts naming the City of Belleville as co-insured.

(810) All pertinent permits and licenses as required by the City, County and State have been secured for the operation.

Section 2. That conflicting Ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force the time this takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on September 1, 2016, provided that it must be passed, approved and published as provided by law.
