We look forward to completing the much needed renovations to our City Hall at 101 South Illinois Street. The ADA (American with Disabilities Act) improvements and safety upgrades are a must, as well as removing a large amount of old asbestos. We hope that all city offices will return to City Hall by May. It has definitely been longer than we originally thought. Renovations will be well worth the wait to better serve the needs of our citizens and business for years to come.

Redeveloping the Meredith Home property on the Public Square seems to be moving in the right direction. Saving this important downtown building was clearly a concern of many citizens.

We are planning to start Phase I of the next streetscape project on West Main Street from 6th Street to 17th Street.

The City's Wastewater Department has the expanded treatment plant up and running and is moving forward with its IEPA-mandated Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) projects. Work is underway to complete the third phase of the LTCP that will eliminate four combined sewer overflows in the area around the Belleville Khoury League and Southside Park. Several other sewer installation projects throughout the city are nearing completion. These new sewer lines will provide service for residential and commercial growth.

In closing, thank you to our dedicated city staff and countless volunteers who contribute in so many ways to make Belleville a great place to live. I wish all of you a very happy and prosperous 2017.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

The City's Street Department tries to ensure that streets remain clear of ice and snow. Businesses and residents are asked to do their part as well, and to be aware of factors affecting snow removal.

Streets marked as Snow Routes need to be kept free of parked cars during inclement weather. When a significant accumulation of snow and ice is forecast, cars should be removed from all public streets so the city's snow and ice removal vehicles can maneuver safely. In places where no other parking is available, residents are asked to park on one side of the street. Snow plows require an open path with a minimum width of 12 feet to maneuver safely and effectively.

Snow should not be transferred to the roadways from private property. This includes snow from parking lots and residential driveways.



Designated Snow Routes & Primary Routes will be cleared first. These routes include streets leading to hospitals, fire houses, the court house, and the county jail.

Streets surrounding and leading to schools must be cleared for safety. If schools are cancelled, or inclement weather falls on weekends or holidays, these streets will be cleared in rotation for that region. Residential streets and subdivisions are cleared using a grid pattern.

But, BEWARE! During cold weather, these bodies of water can appear to be frozen when in fact, they are not safe for walking or playing on. All sources clearly state that ice is never 100 percent safe.

Ice strength is based on many factors, like thickness, temperature, and age. Moving water, snow cover, and fish activity reduce ice formation, making it even more dangerous. If you see anyone on the ice, tell them to carefully get back to shore. If they fall in, stay on the bank and call 911 immediately.

While some areas of the country have



extended periods of freezing temperatures where lakes can freeze and ice can form that is strong enough to support recreational activities, Belleville is not one of them. **Swimming and ice skating are prohibited on all City owned ponds and lakes. Be safe, and STAY OFF THE ICE!**




