CITY'S CREDIT RATING CLIMBS

On October 24, Standard & Poor's Ratings Services, a leading global credit rating, research and risk analysis firm raised Belleville's credit rating from "A+" to "AA-."

The rating was assigned in connection with the issuance of bonds that will be used to develop the new police station and renovate the City Hall. The rating change is expected to save the City more than ½ million dollars in interest cost.

Standard & Poor's cited several factors for the "AA-" rating including strong management supported by good financial management practices, strong reserves, and strong liquidity (cash). In addition, Standard & Poor's noted that the City's strengths include "use of conservative revenue and expenditure assumptions in its budget-

ing process, strong oversight of budget-to-actual results during the year, long-term capital plan, and 45-day cash balance target."

The City's financial advisor, Joy Howard, principal of WM Financial Strategies, said that while Standard & Poor's noted many factors that affected the rating, the rating agency was particularly impressed by the City's excellent financial management and its rebuilding of reserves since the Great Recession.

Mayor Eckert noted that "a bond rating is like a personal credit score. The better the score the lower the borrowing cost. The City has been effectively managing its finances and rebuilding reserves which will now lower the City's borrowing cost and benefit all of Belleville's stakeholders."

NATURE-BASED PLAY AREA UPDATE

As stated in the last newsletter, the City of Belleville was awarded a Building Better Communities Grant from the American Water Charitable Foundation and the National Recreation and Park Association to construct a Natural Playground at Bellevue Park. The City was one of four communities in the country to be awarded this grant. This project is designed to connect and educate people on environmental stewardship, as well as enhance outdoor play opportunities for children. Work continues on this project. The main components, including a slide, rock scramble, log slideway, tree deck, rock climbing wall, tree benches, gazebo, and challenge course, have been installed. Look for trees to be planted and interpretive signage to be installed this winter. Fish and waterfowl feeding stations will also be installed. A community work day and ribbon cutting





SKATING ON THIN ICE

Belleville has numerous wonderful gathering places throughout the City with scenic ponds and lakes, including South Side Park, Bellevue Park, and our newest park - Bicentennial Park, which are open for all to enjoy. But, BEWARE! During cold weather, these bodies of water can appear to be frozen when in fact, they are not safe for walking or playing on. All sources clearly state that ice is never 100 percent safe.

Ice strength is based on many factors, like thickness, temperature,



and age. Moving water, snow cover and fish activity reduce ice formation, making it even more dangerous. If you see anyone on the ice, tell them to carefully get back to shore. If they fall in, stay on the bank and call 911 immediately!

While some areas of the country have extended periods of freezing temperatures where lakes can freeze and ice can form that is strong enough to support recreational activities, Belleville is not one of them. Swimming and ice skating are prohibited on all City park lakes. Be safe, and STAY OFF THE ICE!

HYPER-REACH FREE EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION FOR CITIZENS OF BELLEVILLE

Hyper-Reach is a free service provided to the citizens of Belleville to notify them about urgent situations that may be occurring in the community.

Hyper-Reach allows the 9-1-1 Center to quickly send a recorded message to telephones in specific areas and alert residents to any emergency situations that require immediate action. The system delivers critical information to residents and provides guidance on what precautions need to be taken by residents during and after an incident. Hyper-Reach is able to send notifications in five ways: landline phone message, cell phone message, text message, TTY, and email, to inform residents of

situations such as a weather emergency, water boil advisory, a lost child, a vicious animal at large, or a street issue.

COOLING AND HEATING SITES OFFER RELIEF

Cooling sites offer the general public air-conditioned relief and cool water during the hottest part of the day. Sites are activated if an Excessive Heat Advisory or Warning is issued by the National Weather Service.

Heat Advisory - Heat Index is expected to reach 105° F or air temperature reaches at least 100° F.

Heat Warning - Heat Index is expected to reach at least 110° F for 2 consecutive days with a minimum Heat Index no lower than 75° F at night, or if Heat Advisory is expected to last 4 or more days.

Heating sites agree to open their doors for individuals to seek shelter from excessive cold conditions. Excessive cold indicators are: wind chill expected to be -15 degrees or less, or the stagnant air temperature is 15 degrees or less.

For information on specific sites that will be operating in Belleville in the event that an Excessive Cold or Heat Advisory or Warning is issued by the National Weather Service, visit belleville.net. 


