

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A BUREAU OF FIRE PREVENTION, PROVIDING OFFICERS THEREFOR, AND DEFINING THEIR POWERS AND DUTIES was placed on first reading on a motion made by Alderman Uhl and seconded by Alderman Luehder. Members voting aye on roll call: Scheich, Forayt, Teel, Lonsdale, Dolansky, Stein, Mueller, Tiemann, Koch, Schneider, Schloemann, Nichols, Luehder, Uhl.

Alderman Mueller asked whether the appointment of an inspector, as provided for in Section 1 of the ordinance, would be an additional salaried job.

Alderman Koch replied that it would not be an additional job but would all be handled by present members of the fire department.

Alderman Teel asked whether the time for the monthly fire drills for schools and other educational institution could be controlled so as not to have them take place under adverse weather conditions.

Alderman Nichols stated that the time for the fire drills at the schools was under the complete jurisdiction of the principal of each school.

Fire Chief Wade said that the drills need not always be a surprise to the students of the schools but that the surprise element does make for a more effective drill. He also stated that many of the duties or provisions as set out in the ordinance are now being done by members of his department.

The rules were then suspended and the ordinance was placed on second reading by title only on a motion made by Alderman Koch and seconded by Alderman Teel.

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) PARKING FACILITIES BONDS OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS was placed on first reading on a motion made by Alderman Uhl and seconded by Alderman Nichols.

Members voting aye on roll call: Scheich, Teel, Lonsdale, Dolansky, Schneider, Schloemann, Nichols, Luehder, Uhl.

Members voting naye: Forayt, Stein, Mueller, Tiemann, Koch.

Alderman Mueller stated that he was opposed to the proposed purchase of the lot because he does not think this lot is worth \$75,000 plus interest costs. He further stated that the location and size would not help downtown shoppers and he feels it will tie the City down to be obligated for 15 years in paying for these bonds.

Mayor Munie then stated that the City is confronted with a problem and that on the street parking cannot be encouraged any further. He said the State Highway, which is going through the City, will demand off the street parking and the City must get lots somewhere so that parking may be taken off the streets and put into lots. The Mayor said that he was not saying that the purchase of this lot was the answer but that, if not this lot, then other lots must be made available to the public, in order to hold business downtown.

Alderman Uhl said that he feels off the street parking is in the near future and that he does not think the price is too much for the lot in question.

Alderman Schloemann stated that he thinks, since the purchase of the lot is to help the businessman, the businessman should contribute something to the purchase of it.

Alderman Nichols replied that by protecting business, business makes its contribution in assessed valuation and that if the business moves out of the City, because of lack of parking for shoppers, the City will lose this assessed valuation. He suggested that the Mayor make a recommendation to the Council as to what should be done with this Ordinance. Mr. Nichols stated that he would like to have the property appraised by a qualified real estate broker to determine whether the lot is priced too high.

Alderman Mueller asked if it was possible to have two appraisals.

Alderman Nichols then made a motion to refer the ordinance back to the committee. Alderman Teel seconded the motion.

Alderman Nichols made a further motion that the Mayor be requested to appoint three qualified appraisers to appraise the property and make their report by the next Council meeting. Alderman Mueller seconded this motion.

Alderman Tiemann made a motion, seconded by Alderman Forayt, to accept this bond.




