Alderman Ovian: I want to bring up something that we finally had very positive meeting last Wednesday June 29th at Housing. I want to commend Scott Tyler; I want to commend Dean Hardt and I want to commend our IT Director. Each of these proposals now, are available to us in the Report a Concern, where you can pick out your whole month's work just by looking at it to see if it is closed, open, or on hold. You may wonder why I am so concerned about this, we never had it before. I am also concerned because we are failing as a body of work for the City of Belleville. We do not enforce our Ordinances. Keep in mind that we had this Ordinance that I helped to create called the Vacant Housing Ordinance on September 1, 2018, never once, has it been used. Ladies and Gentlemen, we got more damn vacant houses in our community then we do have actual, that people don't live in. Secondly, and most importantly, many of you are concerned about the property there at 4529 West Main Street at the corner of the Belt Line, which housed the Payday Loan. That property has been condemned longer than I have been an Alderman, and I have been an Alderman for seven years. The place has nothing but asbestos in it, they want to tear it down, but they don't want to fix it. They want to put a \$300,000 piece of property up there that is going to cause a problem for our Ward and the traffic in the area. The only way they can do this is, if we allow it, is for them to go ahead and change the Ordinance, because right now they do not meet the Ordinance. The Ordinance says they have to be four hundred feet away, they are only two hundred and seventy-three feet. They don't have enough parking; they want to go ahead and use parking off of the Bellevue parking lot for this purpose. Why? Because it creates a \$182,000 in grab money for the City. Shame on us if we can't find other means of income. Finally, who in the world is going to pay our Police Officers to go ahead and direct traffic day and night to this place? In Collinsville, and I know this exactly because I know some of the Police Officers, they had to go ahead and push people back all the way to the hotel and let them come in certain numbers, why did they do that? Because they were dealing drugs while they were going after their marijuana stash. So, it is not perfect, but we need to go ahead and start handing out the Ordinances that we have on the books and enforce it. This gentleman that owns this property at 4529 West Main Street he should have been served a long time ago. I got people in my Ward right now that basically are buying property rent-to-own, that is a no-no. You are supposed to go ahead and record it in Crime Free Housing, you cannot go ahead and rent-to-own and basically and not put it in Crime Free Housing. Look in the Housing Code, it is there, but we don't enforce it.

Mayor Gregory: That actually, what you're talking about, the Payday Loan was condemned over ten years ago, and I agree with you. I went in there, Alderwoman Osthoff was with me, and Cliff Cross, the walls look like they were painted with mold. I could not even be in there for less than two minutes because I was sick, it was so terrible. But I would like to remind you that Ordinances have not been changed in years. Now that we have a new Economic Developer, we are changing a lot of the Ordinances. I will tell you; we were not prepared for Q-Alert. Q-Alert is a fabulous tool for Cities, but it also tripled and quadrupled reports. So, we are now working on getting more Code Inspectors. But, believe me, I know that the people in this City with Scott Tyler in charge of Health and Housing and other people are committed to getting these things tackled and finished. It is very hard, when every day, you have four and five times the amount that you use to average on a daily basis. Those departments are doing the best they can while they are reviewing all of these Ordinances. I totally agree with you, especially about, in fact, I told the owner from St. Louis when I was there looking at that property I told him why this has been condemned, you haven't put any money into it, and he was allowed to keep it open, he asked for permission to keep it open so that it would be easier for him to sell if the property, if the building was there. That permission

was given and that has been in the past, but now you see, I totally agree with you on many things that you have said, but that is why we are changing things, and I appreciate your comments.

Alderman Ovian: There is one more thing I would like to say and then I am done. We have stickers that we put on houses that are to be inspected. I go by 9605 which use to be part of the same property chain before he sold it and we stuck it on the window, one it does not have a date when it was done, two it doesn't say what it includes and three when is it supposed to be completed. What in the world, what good is it?

Mayor Gregory: Raffi, this has been going on for years. I am glad your brought it to my attention because we will definitely be discussing that.

Alderman Ovian: That is part of the inspector's job.

Mayor Gregory: I agree.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

This Intergovernmental Agreement is entered into on the date written below by and between the Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois University, a body politic and corporate of the state of Illinois, by Southern Illinois University Carbondale on behalf of its School of Law, (“SIU”) and the City of Belleville, Illinois (“City”), an Illinois municipality organized and existing under the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-1-1 *et seq.*).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that units of local government and the State may jointly contract or otherwise associate to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power or functions, in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*) provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a public agency may be exercised and enjoined jointly with any other public agency; and

WHEREAS, SIU and the City desire to memorialize an agreement for SIU’s non-exclusive use of Classroom C102 and Office C107 (“Premises”) at the City’s educational campus located at 2300 West Main Street, Belleville, Illinois (“Campus”).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

1. Recitals Incorporated by Reference.

The recitals to this Intergovernmental Agreement are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof.

2. Use. For the term of this Intergovernmental Agreement, the City permits SIU to use the Premises for instruction related to the SIU School of Law *Metro East Criminal Justice Experiential Learning Program*, on the dates/times identified in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein, and such other dates/times as may be approved by the City in writing. Otherwise, the City may utilize the Premises for City Campus operations at any and all times that the Premises is not reserved for SIU pursuant to Exhibit A. SIU shall comply will all applicable laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and policies. SIU shall further provide adequate supervision of the Premises during its use thereof to ensure proper care and use of same. SIU shall not alter the Premises in any way without the prior written consent of the City.

3. Term. The term of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be two (2) years from August 15, 2022 through August 14, 2025, unless terminated sooner as provided herein. Either party may terminate this Intergovernmental Agreement with cause upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Such “cause” is a breach of this Intergovernmental Agreement that is not cured within thirty (30) days written notice thereof from the other party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the nature of breach is such that it cannot be reasonably cured within such thirty

(30) day period, such period may be extended up to an additional thirty (30) days (not to exceed sixty (60) days in total) so long as the breaching party is diligently pursuing and prosecuting such cure toward completion.

4. Indemnification and Hold Harmless.

A. To the extent permitted by law and not inconsistent with the doctrine of sovereign immunity, SIU shall indemnify and hold harmless the City, its agents and employees, from any claims, costs, demands, or action arising out of the negligent and/or reckless acts or omissions of SIU, its agents or employees during the term of this Intergovernmental Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing or any other term or condition of this Agreement, under no circumstances with SIU's obligation to indemnify or hold another party harmless exceed the limits of its liability under Illinois law had the claim giving rise to such obligation been brought directly against SIU. To the extent permitted by law, the City shall indemnify and hold harmless SIU, its agents and employees, from any claims, costs, demands, or action arising out of the negligent and/or reckless acts or omissions of the City, its agents or employees, during the term of this Intergovernmental Agreement.

B. SIU's obligation to indemnify and hold harmless shall apply only to injuries or damage arising out of the SIU School of Law *Metro East Criminal Justice Experiential Learning Program*, during the term of this Intergovernmental Agreement. If the City is notified of any such alleged injury, the City shall notify SIU within a reasonably prompt time. Notice shall be sent in accordance with Section 7 hereof.

5. Insurance.

A. For the entire term of this Agreement SIU will maintain the following insurance coverage:

i. By and through the Southern Illinois University Self Insurance Program and for the entirety of this Agreement SIU will maintain comprehensive general liability insurance and professional liability insurance coverage each having limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and a \$3,000,000 general aggregate.

ii. Automobile liability coverage furnished to SIU by the State of Illinois through the State of Illinois Self-Insured Automobile Liability Plan, administered by the State of Illinois Department of Central Management Services, providing coverage of \$1,000,000 for all state-owned and leased vehicles while engaged in state business; and

iii. Workers' compensation and employer liability is provided through the State of Illinois Self-Insured Workers' Compensation Plan, providing statutory limits of coverage for all State employees.

Certificates of Insurance providing evidence of these coverages may be provided upon request from the City. In the event of cancellation or non-renewal of above-described insurance, SIU shall provide thirty (30) days advance written notice of such cancellation or non-renewal.

B. For the entire term of this Agreement City will maintain commercial general liability insurance covering its operations and the Campus, including the Premises, and having limits of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence and a \$3,000,000 general aggregate and workers compensation and employer liability insurance covering its employees. The foregoing coverage may be provided through a qualified program of self insurance, through insurers authorized to do business in the State of Illinois, or through a combination thereof. Certificates of Insurance providing evidence of these coverages shall be provided upon request from SIU. In the event of cancellation or non-renewal of above-described insurance, SIU shall provide thirty (30) days advance written notice of such cancellation or non-renewal.

6. Strict Compliance. No failure by either party to insist upon the strict performance of any covenant, term or condition of this Intergovernmental Agreement, or to exercise any right or remedy upon a breach thereof, shall constitute a waiver of any such breach or any subsequent breach of such covenant, term or condition. No waiver of any breach shall affect or alter this Intergovernmental Agreement, but each and every covenant, term and condition of this Intergovernmental Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

7. Notice. All notices, requests, approvals, demands and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Intergovernmental Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given and to be effective when delivered personally (including delivery by express or courier service) or, if mailed, three (3) business days after being deposited in the United States mail as registered or certified matter, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed as follows or to such other address as either party may designate by notice to the other party in accordance with this Paragraph 7:

8. Amendments. Neither this Intergovernmental Agreement nor any term or provision hereof may be changed, waived, discharged or terminated, except by an instrument in writing signed by both of the parties hereto.

9. Captions. The captions to this Intergovernmental Agreement are for convenience of reference only and in no way define or limit the scope or intent of this Intergovernmental Agreement.

10. **Assignment.** This Intergovernmental Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the express written consent of the other party's authorized representative.

11. **Controlling Law.** This Intergovernmental Agreement, and any dispute arising thereunder, shall be governed by, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.

12. **Severability.** If, for any reason, any clause or provision of this Intergovernmental Agreement, or the application of any clause to a particular context or to a particular situation, circumstance or person, should be held unenforceable, invalid or in violation of law by any court or other tribunal, the application of such clause or provision in other contexts or to other situations, circumstances or persons shall not be affected thereby, and the remaining clauses and provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.

13. **Entire Agreement.** This Intergovernmental Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and any and all prior understandings, agreements, correspondence, conversations or memoranda regarding same are merged herein.

14. **Nonexclusive Agreement.** This Intergovernmental Agreement is independent of, and in addition to, any other contracts or mutual agreements between the parties and to any other contracts or agreements to which SIU, the City, or either of them is a party.



and all claims, suits, actions or proceeds (“Claims”) against such parties based upon the infringement or alleged infringement, or violation or alleged violation, of (a) any United States patent and (b) any copyright, trademark, trade secret or other proprietary right of a third party which is enforceable in the United States, as a result of Buyer's use of the product or equipment within the United States, provided that: (i) Buyer gives Seller prompt written notice of any such Claim, (ii) Buyer gives Seller full authority to defend or settle any such Claim, and (iii) Buyer gives Seller proper and full information and assistance, at Seller's expense (except for Buyer's employees' time) to defend or settle any such Claim. **THE FOREGOING IS IN LIEU OF ANY WARRANTIES OF NONINFRINGEMENT, WHICH ARE HEREBY DISCLAIMED.** The foregoing obligation of Seller does not apply with respect to products or equipment or portions or components thereof (a) not supplied by Seller, (b) made in whole or in part in accordance with Buyer or owner specifications, (c) which are modified after shipment by Seller, if the alleged infringement related to such modification, (d) combined with other products, processes or materials where the alleged infringement relates to such combination, (e) where Buyer continues allegedly infringing activity after being notified thereof and/or after being informed of modifications that would have avoided the alleged infringement without significant loss of performance or functionality, or (f) where Buyer's use of the product or equipment is incident to an infringement not resulting primarily from the product or equipment; Buyer will indemnify Seller and its officers, directors, agents, and employees from all damages, settlements, attorneys' fees and expenses related to a claim of infringement, misappropriation, defamation, violation of rights of publicity or privacy excluded from Seller's indemnity obligation herein.

(9) **GOVERNING LAW.** The formation and performance of the Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri, U.S.A. Any action for breach of the Agreement or any covenant or warranty must be commenced within one year after the cause of action has accrued unless such provision is not permitted by applicable law.

(10) **DISPUTE RESOLUTION.** Seller shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine whether any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to the Agreement, or the breach thereof, shall be submitted to a court of law or arbitrated. The venue for any such arbitration shall be in St. Louis, Missouri. The arbitrator's award may be confirmed and reduced to judgment in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the event the matter is submitted to a court, Seller and Buyer hereby agree to waive their right to trial by jury and covenant that neither of them will request trial by jury in any such litigation.

(11) **SOFTWARE LICENSE.** To the extent software is provided by Seller under the Agreement, Buyer agrees that such software may only be used in accordance with the terms and conditions of the software license agreement that accompanies the software. Buyer agrees not to directly or indirectly decompile, disassemble, reverse engineer or otherwise derive the source code for the software. If Buyer is a U.S. Government agency, Buyer acknowledges that the software licensed under the Agreement is a commercial item that has been developed at private expense and not under a Government contract. The Government's rights relating to the software are limited to those rights applicable to Buyer's as set forth herein and is binding on Government users in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation 48 C.F.R. Section 12.212 for non-defense agencies and/or Defense FAR Supplement 48 C.F.R. Section 227.7202-1 for defense agencies.

(12) MISCELLANEOUS

(a) **CHANGES OF CONSTRUCTION AND DESIGN.** Seller reserves the right to change or revise the construction and design of the products or equipment purchased by Buyer, without liability or obligation to incorporate such changes to products or equipment ordered by Buyer unless specifically agreed upon in writing reasonably in advance of the delivery date for such products or equipment. Buyer agrees to bear the expense of meeting any changes or modifications in local code requirements which become effective after Seller has accepted Buyer's order.

(b) **CHARACTER OF PRODUCT AND SECURITY INTEREST:** The goods delivered by Seller under the terms of the Agreement shall remain personal property and retain its character as such no matter in what manner affixed or attached to any structure or property. Buyer grants Seller a security interest in said goods, any replacement parts and any proceeds thereof until all sums due Seller have been paid to it in cash. This security interest shall secure all indebtedness or obligations of whatsoever nature now or hereafter owing Buyer to Seller. Buyer shall pay all expenses of any nature whatsoever incurred by Seller in connection with said security interest.

(c) **INSURANCE:** Buyer agrees to insure the goods delivered under the Agreement in an amount at least equal to the purchase price against loss or damage from fire, wind, water or other causes. The insurance policies are to be made payable to Seller and Buyer in accordance with their respective interests, and when issued are to be delivered to Seller and held by it. Failure to take out and maintain such insurance shall entitle Seller to declare the entire purchase price to be immediately due and payable and shall also entitle Seller to recover possession of said goods.

(d) **INSTALLATION:** If installation by the Seller is included within the Seller's Quotation, Buyer shall provide all of the following at its own expense and at all times pertinent to the installation: i) free, dry, and reasonable access to Buyer's premises; and ii) proper foundations, lighting, power, water and storage facilities reasonably required.

(e) **COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS:** Seller's obligations are subject to the export administration and control laws and regulations of the United States. Buyer shall comply fully with such laws and regulation in the export, resale or disposition of purchased products or equipment. Quotations or proposals made, and any orders accepted by Seller from a Buyer outside the United States are with the understanding that the ultimate destination of the products or equipment is the country indicated therein. Diversion of the products or equipment to any other destination contrary to the United States is prohibited. Accordingly, if the foregoing understanding is incorrect, or if Buyer intends to divert the products or equipment to any other destination, Buyer shall immediately inform Seller of the correct ultimate destination.




WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement in order to set forth the terms upon which the City would provide certain economic incentives for the Project and the terms upon which **Knipp Roofing & Exteriors, Inc. & SJH Properties, LLC** would provide jobs at said location.

Responsibilities of the City of Belleville

1. Sell the property located at 14 South 11th St. (parcel 08-21.0-336-009) for the sum of \$1.00 to SJH Properties, LLC, and;

3. Notices. Notices, or other communications required or which may be given under this Agreement shall be in writing, and delivered either personally, or by certified or registered mail, to the addresses indicated for each party below after their respective signatures, or to such other address as designated by a party similar notice to the other party. Date of notice shall be the date of delivery in the case of delivered notice or the date of posting in the mail in the case of mail notice.
4. Signage. Agree to allow City to place on the premises a sign indicating financial assistance has been provided by the City of Belleville for a minimum of fifteen (15) days each before and after opening of the facility.
5. Current with Payments. Agree to pay in full the City of Belleville on any outstanding invoices containing the name or names of the individual, company and/or corporation receiving the said inducements.
6. Execution of Agreement. If this agreement is not fully executed within sixty (60) days of City Council approval, it shall be considered null and void.
7. Prevailing Wage. Projects receiving incentives/inducements from the City of Belleville will be required to comply with the President's executive order no. 11246, as amended (prevailing wage).
8. Superseder. This Agreement supersedes and replaces any and all prior agreements and understandings between the City and **Wise Guys Eatery** with respect to the subject matter hereof.
9. Request of Payment. The party receiving inducements must officially request payment from the City. This must be done via letter to include documentation of costs incurred as outlined in the section titled "Responsibilities of **Wise Guys Eatery**".
10. Compliance Reporting. Agree to submit Annual Certification of Compliance With Development Agreement form to document compliance with items as outlined in the section titled "Responsibilities of **Wise Guys Eatery**". Such reporting is required for the life of the agreement, which is defined as the timeframe of the commitment to remain and operate at the project location as identified in the section titled "Responsibilities of **Wise Guys Eatery**".



9. APPLY SLURRY UNIFORMLY TO ALL AREAS BEING SEED. RATE OF APPLICATION AS REQUIRED TO OBTAIN SPECIFIED SEED SOWING RATE.
10. THE SOD SHALL BE RELATIVELY FREE OF DISEASES AND WEEDS. STONES LARGER THAN 1 1/2" IN ANY DIMENSION, PLANT ROOTS AND OTHER MATERIAL DETRIMENTAL TO A HEALTHY STAND OF TURF SHOULD BE REMOVED. **INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN
THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE/BELLEVILLE POLICE AND
HARMONY-EMGE SCHOOL DISTRICT 175
TO ESTABLISH A “COPS IN SCHOOLS”
SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO) PROGRAM**

THIS AGREEMENT, effective as of August 1, 2022, is made and entered in pursuit of the mutually desirable goal of providing a safe, violence free, gang free, and drug free learning environment for Harmony-Emge School District 175 students and staff, the City of Belleville (City) and Harmony-Emge School District 175 agree to the following.

Article 1: Principles

1. The Belleville Police Department (BPD) will assign one (1) regularly employed uniformed police officer and marked patrol unit to Harmony-Emge School District 175 during the regular school year. During school holidays and vacations, or during a police emergency, BPD may temporarily reassign the school resource officer.
2. The School Resource Officer (SRO) will have a base of operations at Harmony-Emge School District 175, including office space and a telephone on the campus.
3. The SRO shall be assigned full-time to Harmony-Emge School District 175 during the regular school year. The SRO shall work an eight (8) hour shift, usually 8:00 am. until 4:00 pm., including lunch time. Start and end times may change or vary due to overall hours of student attendance, or if a situation necessitates a change. All hours in addition to the regular eight-hour shift shall be paid as overtime as defined by the BPD’s most current collective bargaining agreement between the Officers and Sergeants of Local FOP #226.
4. BPD (not Harmony-Emge School District 175) shall employ the SRO, and the officer shall remain responsive to the BPD chain of command and policies, be subject to the administration, supervision, and control of the Police Department, be subject to the personnel rules of the City and Police Department, and shall perform all of the duties, as that employment requires. In the event that this Agreement conflicts with the City’s obligations to the SRO under the F.O.P Union labor agreement and/or the terms of the labor agreement between the City and the F.O.P. Union, the terms of the F.O.P. agreement effective as of the date in question shall govern. The officer shall act as an extension of Harmony-Emge School District 175 administration in dealing with a variety of situations and issues as outlined in Article II below.
- 4.5. The City shall conduct, at its own cost and expense, all required criminal background checks, psychological tests and any other pre-employment tests and background checks of the individuals selected to serve as the School Resource Officer. The City shall not allow any officer to be assigned to the School Resource Officer position if his/her criminal background check reveals convictions that would prohibit him or her from working with children under Illinois law and specifically Section 10-21.9 of the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/10-21.9)
6. Harmony-Emge School District 175 shall reimburse the City for each day it uses the SRO based on 180 school attendance days in a regular school year. The reimbursement rate shall be at the SRO’s regular rate of pay to include any overtime pay. All overtime hours

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worked by the SRO for Harmony-Emge School District 175 must be approved by the Harmony-Emge School District 175 Superintendent. The Police Department shall ensure that the School Resource Officer keeps a detailed time record of on-duty time under this Agreement. The Police Department shall prepare an invoice, itemized by day, for each month of the Agreement, and shall transmit said invoice to the District within five (5) business days of the end of the month.

5.7. The City and Police Department shall maintain the School Resource Officer’s payroll, attendance, and performance evaluation records. The City and Police Department shall be responsible for compensating the School Resource Officers, including overtime and employee benefits, including workers compensation, as provided in the City and Police Department’s personnel policies, subject to the reimbursement provisions herein. All wages and disability payments, pension and worker’s compensation claim, damages or causes of action for personal injury, damages to equipment, and medical expenses of the School Resource Officer incurred while performing duties as a law enforcement officer for the Police Department shall be borne by and remain the responsibility of the City and Police Department.

6.8. BPD will bill Harmony-Emge School District 175 monthly, and Harmony-Emge School District 175 shall pay the invoiced total amount— in accordance with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act, 50 ILCS 505/1 et seq., as soon as practical, but not later than 30 days after receipt of the bill.

7.9. The selection, placement, replacement, and dismissal of the SRO are as follows:

- A. BPD shall administer the SRO personnel selection process in consultation with Harmony-Emge School District 175.
- B. The SRO shall be approved by Harmony-Emge School District 175 Superintendent or their designee prior to final assignment.
- C. Harmony-Emge School District 175 Superintendent may request replacement of the SRO.
- D. The Chief of Police or their designee shall evaluate the request and attempt to resolve any concerns in the interests of all parties involved.
- E. The Chief of Police may replace the SRO, provided Harmony-Emge School District 175 receives a minimum of 15 days advance notification.

10. Training.

- A. The Police Department shall enroll the SRO in all necessary training for law enforcement officers pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act, 50 ILCS 705, and the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board policies and procedures, in order to carry a concealed firearm and live ammunition while on duty.
- B. The Police Department shall enroll the SRO in all necessary training for school resource officers pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act, 50 ILCS 705, and the

Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board policies and procedures, in accordance with the certified training program for school resource officers.

E.C. The Police Department shall pay all costs associated with basic law enforcement and annual training courses. The District will reimburse the Police Department for any School Resource Officer training.

Article II: School Resource Officer Duties, Responsibilities, and Policing Strategies

1. The SRO will coordinate all activities with the administration and seek permission, advice, and guidance prior to enacting any program within the school.
2. The SRO shall conduct investigations and take law enforcement actions as required and permitted pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Compiled Statutes (including the Juvenile Court Act), Belleville City ordinances, other legal mandates, department policy and the rules of the school. Such law enforcement actions shall include, but not be limited to the following:
 - A. Take appropriate action against intruders and trespassers on school property and within the jurisdiction of the school administration.
 - B. Provide reasonable protection for the academic environment and assist in maintaining an atmosphere of safety necessary for good teaching, productive learning, and positive social interaction.
 - C. Serve as the primary liaison between BPD and the school.
3. The SRO shall assist the school administration in developing plans and strategies to minimize dangerous situations, including those related to student or community unrest, which could impact the school. Emphasis will center on the development, implementation, monitoring, and updating of Harmony-Emge School District 175 crisis management plan.
4. The SRO may work with the administration to provide programs and presentations designed to promote school and public safety, as well as student understanding and respect of the law and law enforcement.
5. The SRO will aid and work with the administration and guidance staff in providing students and students’ families with information concerning community support agencies, including, but not limited to, family counseling services, drug and alcohol treatment facilities and programs, psychological services, legal assistance, health services, and any other assistance programs.
6. The SRO shall make himself or herself reasonably available for student, parental, administrative, or faculty meetings or conferences, at the request of the administration, to exert a positive influence on a variety of situations and to solicit support and understanding for the school and its programs.

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7. The SRO will, at the request of the administration, confer with students, parents, and staff members to help educate them and assist them with problems within the scope of his or her knowledge, authority, or expertise, such as alcohol and drug abuse, gang activity, violence, sexual harassment, and peer pressure.
8. The SRO shall, in conjunction with the school, work with other law enforcement and government agencies, including, but not limited to, the State’s Attorney’s Office, and the Department of Children and Family Services.
9. The SRO will be available at the request of the administration to attend school functions, including athletic events, concerts, plays, and assemblies.
10. The SRO will take necessary law enforcement action as required, and shall inform the administration whenever practical prior to taking such actions. The Administration shall keep the SRO appropriately informed about matters affecting building security, student discipline, general safety, and unlawful activity occurring on campus or in relation to the school.
11. The SRO shall prepare and maintain any mandated reports, records or other data required by BPD and Harmony-Emge School District 175.
12. The SRO shall not be involved in the enforcement of school discipline. Student discipline and school policy violations are the sole responsibility of the Administration. The SRO may become involved in discipline matters to determine whether law enforcement action is required when requested, and the Administration believes a situation involves a violation of the law.
13. The SRO shall not be regularly assigned to lunchroom duty, hall monitoring, restroom checks, or other routine monitoring duties, unless these areas are frequent disturbance or violent (fighting) hot spots. If such conditions are prevalent in these areas, the SRO should assist the school by working such areas until the problem has improved or is resolved.
14. The SRO shall attempt to establish a good rapport with students and will maintain a high visible presence on and about the campus.
15. The SRO will be commissioned with the St. Clair County Sheriff’s Department. The SRO will have jurisdiction while at Ellis School to take law enforcement action. The SRO will act as a liaison between Ellis School and the St. Clair County Sheriff’s

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Department. The St. Clair County Sheriff’s Office will maintain primary jurisdiction of Ellis School.

16. Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 922(q)(2)(B), the SRO is authorized to carry a firearm and live ammunition on District property and within 1,000 feet of said school district property while on and off-duty.
17. Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 922(q)(3)(B), the SRO is permitted to discharge or attempt to discharge a firearm on District property and within 1,000 feet of said school district property while on and off-duty.
18. Comply with all Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board policies and procedures related to the use of deadly force.
19. Meet and maintain all annual training requirements for part-time officers and such other qualifications set forth in the Illinois Police Training Act, 50 ILCS 705, and the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board policies and procedures in order for the SRO to carry a concealed firearm and live ammunition.
20. Meet and maintain all annual training requirements for school resource officers and such other qualifications set forth in the Illinois Police Training Act, 50 ILCS 705, and the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board policies and procedures in order to be qualified and certified as a school resource officer.
21. The Parties agree that this Agreement constitutes any required notice for on or off-duty officers under 105 ILCS 5/10-27.1A of the Illinois School Code.

Article III: Vehicle, Equipment Costs, and Reimbursement

1. The City Police Department will provide a fully equipped marked patrol vehicle for exclusive use by the SRO’s on the campus and surrounding the campus area in support of his or her primary SRO responsibilities. The SRO may use the vehicle to transport administration, school staff, students (in accordance with department policy and protocols) to school events, meetings or other school activities.
2. Harmony-Emge School District 175 shall reimburse the department for the costs of the fully equipped marked patrol vehicle for seventy-five (75%) percent **\$38,910.00** of the total vehicle costs at **\$51,880.00** over six (6) years. Harmony-Emge School District 175 agrees to make six (6) annual payments of **\$6,485.00** in the regular school year by May 1st of each year.

Article IV: Term of Agreement

1. The initial term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the effective date provided the State of Illinois continues to fund Harmony-Emge School District 175. In

the event the state discontinues funding for Harmony-Emge School District 175, the City and Harmony-Emge School District 175 agree to terminate this Agreement to include the vehicle reimbursement provisions imposed on Harmony-Emge School District 175 listed below in paragraph 3 of this article.

2. This Agreement shall be reviewed by the City Police and Harmony-Emge School District 175 on an annual basis.
3. Harmony-Emge School District 175 agrees to reimburse the City within sixty (60) days for the entire outstanding balance of the SRO marked patrol vehicle if this agreement is terminated by Harmony-Emge School District 175 prior to fulfilling the above reimbursement/repayment terms in Article III, paragraph 2, unless such termination is (1) due to the City’s fault, breach, or default of this agreement, and/or (2) the City terminates the Agreement.
4. The City, Harmony-Emge School District 175, and their agents and employees agree to cooperate in good faith in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement. The parties will resolve unforeseen difficulties, concerns or questions through discussions involving the BPD Chief and Harmony-Emge School District 175 Superintendent or their designees.
5. Harmony-Emge School District 175 shall and hereby does indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City, the Police Department, and its officers, agents and employees (in both their individual and official capacity) against any and all claims, damages, injuries to property or persons (including death), demands, costs or expenses, including the cost of reasonable attorneys’ fees for the defense thereof (collectively, “Loss”), arising from or in connection with the acts or omissions of the District, its employees or agents related to this Agreement or the District’s breach of this Agreement provided that said Loss has not been caused by the negligence or misconduct of the City and its officers or employees. The City and the Police Department shall and hereby does indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Harmony-Emge School District 175 and its agents and employees (in both their individual and official capacity) against any Loss arising from or in connection with the acts or omissions of the City, the Police Department, the SRO or the City and Police Department’s other employees or agents related to this Agreement or the City or Police Department’s breach of this Agreement, provided that said Loss has not been caused by the negligence or misconduct of Harmony-Emge School District 175 and its employees.
6. The City and Police Department agree to assume full responsibility and liability for any damage, including but not limited to worker’s compensation claims, property damage or physical injury, caused by the SRO when performing any law enforcement duties, or other acts or omissions, pursuant to this Agreement.
7. No party to this Agreement waives any defenses or immunities it otherwise has under the law, including without limitation any immunities under the Sections 2-204 or 2-205 of the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act or the

State Employee Indemnification Act (5 ILCS 350/1, et seq.).

8. The City and Police Department shall purchase and maintain, at its own expense, general public liability insurance with limits of not less than \$3,000,000 per occurrence and in the aggregate, during the entire term of this Agreement, against loss on account of bodily injury, death or property damage resulting from any act or omission on the part of the SRO in connection with the duties and obligations under this Agreement. Within seven (7) days of the execution of this Agreement, the City and Police Department shall furnish to the District a certificate of the insurance evidencing the insurance required under this Agreement. The City and Police Department may satisfy the insurance obligations under this Paragraph by utilizing excess or umbrella insurance. For purposes of this Paragraph, insurance may be provided through a self-insured intergovernmental risk pool or agency. The City and Police Department shall name the District and its officers, employees, and board members as additional insureds on all insurance required hereunder, which shall be furnished by the Police Department to the District.

4.9. The School Resource Officer is a law enforcement unit of the District, such that their records are not educational records, pursuant to 20 U.S.C. 1232(g). Additionally, these records are not school records, pursuant to 105 ILCS 10/2(d) and 105 ILCS 5/22-20 of the Illinois School Code.

Article V: Execution

1. The parties may execute this Agreement in counterparts, each of which is deemed an original and all of which only constitute one original.
2. Each of the undersigned represents that this Agreement is duly authorized by the parties represented.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING APPLICATION TO THE 2022 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES PROGRAM (TAP) GRANT FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADDING A SIDEWALK TO STATE STREET FROM ROOSEVELT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO LAKE SHORE DRIVE

WHEREAS, the City of Belleville, St. Clair County, Illinois (hereinafter "City"), is a municipality duly established, existing and operating in accordance with the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code (Section 5/1-1-1 et seq. of Chapter 65 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes); and

WHEREAS, the City proposes to apply for assistance from the Transportation Alternatives Program Grant (TAP) for the purpose of adding a 5'-wide sidewalk along the east side of State Street from Roosevelt Elementary School to Lake Shore Drive; and

WHEREAS, the proposed improvement will consist of providing concrete ADA sidewalks and curb ramps, curb and gutter and storm sewer on the east side of State Street, new pavement markings and an enhanced push button activated at-grade crossing across IL-13, and all other miscellaneous work; and

WHEREAS, the proposed improvements will fill a gap in the existing sidewalk system, connecting to the sidewalk at Roosevelt Elementary and the sidewalk at Lake Shore Drive; and

WHEREAS, filling the gap in this sidewalk system supports the City's plan to provide safe and complete ADA compliant sidewalks for its residents, and this particular connection provides an important route for the children in the neighborhoods along State Street to walk to Roosevelt Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, the City has available funds to finance the activity until reimbursed by TAP, and the financial capability to operate, maintain, and manage the completed project in a safe manner for public use; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined it to be in the best interest of the public health, safety, general welfare and economic welfare to construct the sidewalk along State Street from Roosevelt Elementary School to Lake Shore Drive; and

WHEREAS, the City has determined City Engineer should be authorized and directed to execute any contracts or requisite documents required to apply to TAP for funding to reimburse City for constructing the sidewalk along State Street from Roosevelt Elementary School to Lake Shore Drive; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Belleville as follows:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois.

Section 2. the City shall apply to the TAP for financial assistance for the purposes of adding a 5'-wide concrete sidewalk along the east side of State Street from Roosevelt Elementary School to Lake Shore Drive including providing concrete ADA sidewalks and curb ramps, curb and gutter with adjacent storm sewer on the east side of State Street, new pavement markings, and an enhanced push button activated at-grade crossing across IL-13, and all other miscellaneous work.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be known as Resolution No. 3448-2022 and shall be effective upon its passage and approval in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION 3449

Illinois Department of Transportation
PARADE OR EVENT RESOLUTION
Effective January 1, 2017

WHEREAS, the **City of Belleville** is sponsoring the **Veteran's Day Ceremony** in the City of Belleville which constitutes a public purpose;

WHEREAS, this **Veteran's Day Ceremony** will require the temporary closure of **IL 159 at Public Square**, a State Highway in the City of Belleville on **Friday, November 11, 2022 from 9:00am to 1:00pm**;

WHEREAS, Section 4-408 of the Illinois Highway Code authorizes the Department of Transportation to issue permits to local authorities to temporarily close portions of State Highways for such public purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Belleville that permission to close off **IL 159 at Public Square** on **Friday, November 11, 2022 from 9:00am to 1:00pm** as above designated, be requested of the Department of Transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this closure shall occur during the approximate time period between **Friday, November 11, 2022 from 9:00am to 1:00pm**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that traffic from that closed portion of highway shall be detoured over routes with an all-weather surface that can accept the anticipated traffic, which will be maintained to the satisfaction of the Department and which is conspicuously marked for the benefit of traffic diverted from the State highway. (The parking of vehicles shall be prohibited on the detour routes to allow an uninterrupted flow of two-way traffic.)* The detour route shall be as follows:

* To be used when appropriate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **City of Belleville** assumes full responsibility for the direction, protection, and regulation of the traffic during the time the detour is in effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers or authorized flaggers shall at the expense of the **City of Belleville** be positioned at each end of the closed section and at other points (such as intersections) as may be necessary to assist in directing traffic through the detour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers, flaggers, and officials shall permit emergency vehicles in emergency situations to pass through the closed area as swiftly as is safe for all concerned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all debris shall be removed by the **City of Belleville** prior to reopening the State highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such signs, flags, barricades, etc., shall be used by the **City of Belleville** as may be approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation. These items shall be provided by the **City of Belleville**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the closure and detour shall be marked according to the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an occasional break shall be made in the procession so that traffic may pass through. In any event, adequate provisions will be made for traffic on intersecting highways pursuant to conditions noted above. (Note: This paragraph is applicable when the Resolution pertains to a Parade or when no detour is required.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the **City of Belleville** shall be responsible for any and all injuries to persons or damages to property, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, lawsuits, actions, costs and fees (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) of every nature or description, arising out of, resulting from or connected with the exercise of authority granted by the Department which is the subject of this resolution. The obligation is binding upon the **Veteran's Day Ceremony** regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in part by the act, omission or negligence of the Department or its officers, employees or agents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **City of Belleville** shall provide a comprehensive general liability policy or an additional named insured endorsement in the minimum amount of **\$1,000,000 per person and \$2,000,000 aggregate** which has the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officials, employees and agents as insureds and which protects them from all claims arising from the requested road closing. A copy of said policy or endorsement will be provided to the Department before the road is closed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Transportation, District 8, to serve as a formal request for the permission sought in this resolution and to operate as part of the conditions of said permission.




**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING
THE INSTITUTION OF CONDEMNATION ACTION**

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

WHEREAS, James LaBlance, and possibly others, own, are interested in, or otherwise claim to have some interest in private property commonly referenced as 1300/1405 East Belle Ave., Belleville, Illinois, and further identified as St. Clair County Permanent Parcel Nos. 08-22.0-221-009 and 08-22.0-221-010 (hereinafter referred to as the "Property").

WHEREAS, the City requires a permanent easement (2,645 square feet) and two (2) temporary construction easements (3,121 square feet and 1,165 square feet) on the Property ("Easements") for the public purpose of necessary improvements to the City's storm sewer and sanitary sewer system, as more fully described in Exhibit A attached hereto ("Project").

WHEREAS, the Project is a public work, for public use, and constitutes a public purpose, namely, a public sewer system, and, in order to improve and expand such public sewer system, it is necessary for the City to acquire the Easements on the Property described herein for the use of the residents of the City.

WHEREAS, pursuant to sections pursuant to Section 11-141-10 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-141-10), the City is authorized to acquire by condemnation, for the aforementioned purposes, the Easements on the Property as described herein.

WHEREAS, the compensation to be paid by City for the Easements on the Property described herein cannot be agreed on between City and the interested parties, although the City has attempted to effect such an agreement; the City, therefore, is authorized to proceed to acquire the property under the eminent domain laws of the State of Illinois.

WHEREAS, this City Council desires to authorize the City Attorney to file a Complaint for Condemnation in the Circuit Court of St. Clair County in order to acquire, under the eminent domain laws of the State of Illinois, for the uses and purposes described above, the Easements on the Property described herein, located within the City's jurisdiction in St. Clair County, Illinois, as more fully described in Exhibit A attached hereto, and ascertain/determine just compensation for the Easements on the Property described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. Consistent with Section 11-141-10 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-141-10), this City Council hereby finds that the Easements on the Property are necessary and appropriate for the purpose of improving or extending, or constructing or acquiring and improving and extending the City’s sewer system.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 11-141-10 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-141-10), this City Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Attorney to institute necessary legal action by filing a Complaint for Condemnation in the Circuit Court of St. Clair County, and take any other necessary actions related thereto, on the City’s behalf to acquire, under the eminent domain laws of the State of Illinois, the Easements on the Property described herein.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor as provided by law.



**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III (ADMINISTRATION),
CHAPTER 34 (FINANCE AND REVENUE; TAXATION), SECTION 34.043
(HOTEL AND MOTEL TAX) AND AMENDING TITLE XI (BUSINESS
REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 117 (LODGING BUSINESSES) BY ADDING
SECTIONS 117.50 THROUGH 117.56 (SHORT-TERM RENTALS) OF THE
REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, AS AMENDED**

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE “CITY”), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. **Section 34.043** is hereby amended by repealing Section 34.043 (Hotel and Motel Tax) in its entirety, and substituting in lieu thereof Section 34.043 (Hotel/Motel and Short-Term Rental Tax), as follows:

§ 34.043 HOTEL/~~AND~~ MOTEL AND SHORT-TERM RENTAL TAX.

(G) *Definitions.* For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

HOTEL ROOM or **MOTEL ROOM.** A room within a structure offered to the public for rental on a daily basis and containing facilities for sleeping. One room offered for rental with or without an adjoining bath shall be considered as a single **HOTEL OR MOTEL ROOM.** The number of **HOTEL OR MOTEL ROOMS** within a suite shall be computed on the basis of those rooms utilized for the purpose of sleeping.

OWNER. Any person having an ownership interest in or conducting the operation of a hotel or motel room or receiving the consideration for the rental of such hotel or motel room.

PERSON. Any natural person, trustee, court appointed representative, syndicate, association, partnership, firm, club, company, corporation, business trust, institution, agency, government corporation, municipal corporation, district or other political subdivision, contractor, supplier, vendor, vendee, operator, user or owner, or any officers, agents, employees or other representative, acting either

for himself or herself or for any other person in any capacity, or any other entity recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties. The masculine, feminine, singular or plural is included in any circumstances.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL. An owner-occupied or non-owner-occupied single-family residential abode, including townhomes, condominiums, duplexes and rooming house dwelling units that are either primarily owner-occupied, except for the duration of rental period of thirty (30) days or less, or are owned but not owner-occupied for the duration of any short-term rental period of thirty (30) days or less, subject to the requirements of §117.50 through §117.56 of this Code.

(B) *Tax imposed.*

(1) ~~Beginning on January 1, 2016, t~~There is hereby levied and imposed a tax of 8% of the rent charged for the privilege and use of renting a hotel or motel room within the city for each 24-hour period or any portion thereof for which a daily room charge is made; provided, however, that the tax shall not be levied and imposed upon any person who works and lives in the same hotel or motel and received living accommodations as compensation for work performed. Beginning on August 1, 2022, there is hereby levied and imposed a tax of 8% of the consideration charged for the privilege and use of a short-term rental within the city.

(2) The ultimate incidence of and liability for payment of the tax is to be borne by the person who seeks the privilege of occupying the hotel or motel room, or short-term rental, said person hereinafter referred to as “renter”.

(3) The tax herein levied shall be paid in addition to any and all other taxes and charges. It shall be the duty of the owner of every hotel or motel, or short-term rental, to secure the tax from the renter of the motel or hotel room, or short-term rental, and to pay over to the City Treasurer or any authorized representative of the city the tax under procedures prescribed by the city, or as otherwise provided in this section.

€ *Books and records.* The City Treasurer, or authorized representative, may enter the premises of any hotel or motel, or short-term rental, for inspection and examination of records in order to effectuate the proper administration of this section, and to assure the enforcement of the collection of tax imposed. It shall be unlawful for any person to prevent, hinder or interfere with the City Treasurer or authorized deputy or representative in the discharge of their duties in the performance of this section. It shall be the duty of every owner to keep accurate and complete books and records to which the City Treasurer, or authorized representative, shall at all times have full access, which records shall include a daily sheet showing:

(G) The number of hotel or motel rooms, or short-term rental, rented during the 24-hour period, including multiple rentals of the same hotel or motel room, or short-term rental, where such shall occur; and

(2) The actual hotel or motel, or short-term rental, tax receipts collected for the date in question.

(D) *Transmittal of tax revenue.*

(1) ~~Commencing on 1-1-1991,~~ owner or owners of each hotel or motel, or short-term rental, within the city shall file tax returns showing tax receipts received with respect to each hotel and motel room, or short-term rental, during the previous month. The return shall be due on or before the last day of each succeeding calendar month and the return is to be filed (i.e., return for December tax receipts due on or before the last day of January).

(2) ~~Commencing on 1-1-1991, the tax return and payment for such period shall be due on or before 1-31-1991. Thereafter r~~Reporting periods and taxes shall be paid in accordance with the provisions of this section. At the time of filing the tax returns, the owner shall pay to the City Treasurer all taxes due for the period to which the tax return applies.

(3) If, for any reason, any tax is not paid when due, a penalty at the rate of 1-1/2% per 30-day period, or portion thereof, from the date of delinquency shall be added and collected.

(E) *Collection.* Whenever any person shall fail to pay any tax as herein provided, the Corporation Counsel shall, upon the request of the City Treasurer bring or cause to be brought an action to enforce the payment of the tax on behalf of the city in any court of competent jurisdiction.

(F) *Proceeds of tax and fines.* All proceeds resulting from the imposition of the tax under this section, including penalties, shall be paid into the General Corporate Fund of the city.

(G) *Suspension of licenses.* If the Mayor, after hearing held by or for him or her, shall find that any person has willfully avoided payment of the tax imposed by this section, he or she may suspend or revoke all city licenses held by such tax-evader. The owner, manager or operator of the hotel or motel shall have an opportunity to be heard at such hearing to be held not less than five days after notice of the time and place of the hearing to be held, addressed to him or her at his or her last known place of business.

Section 2. Chapter 117 is hereby amended by adding Section 117.50 through 117.56 (Short-Term Rentals), as follows:

SHORT-TERM RENTALS

§ 117.50 DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this subchapter, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings, and are hereby defined as follows:

DWELLING UNIT. One or more rooms, including individualized bathroom and kitchen facilities, which are arranged, designed, or used as living quarters for a household.

GUEST. A person who rents or occupies a short-term rental.

HOST. An owner or owners engaged in providing short-term rentals.

HOSTING PLATFORM. A marketplace entity, in whatever form or format which facilitates short-term rentals through advertising, matchmaking or other means, using any medium or facilitation, or from which the operator of the hosting platform derives revenue, including booking fees or advertising revenues from providing or maintaining the marketplace information.

NON-OWNER-OCCUPIED SHORT-TERM RENTALS. A single-family residential abode, including townhomes, condominiums, duplexes and rooming house dwelling units that is not owner-occupied but is rented out for short-term rental periods.

OWNER. A person holding title or co-title of an abode, dwelling unit or residence that they may lease as a short-term rental but only in accordance with the terms of this subchapter.

OWNER-OCCUPIED SHORT-TERM RENTALS. An owner-occupied single-family residential abode, including townhomes, condominiums, duplexes and rooming house dwelling units that is primarily owner-occupied, except for the duration of any short-term rental period.

SHORT TERM RENTALS. An owner-occupied or non-owner-occupied single-family residential abode, including townhomes, condominiums, duplexes and rooming house dwelling units that are either primarily owner-occupied, except for the duration of any short-term rental period of thirty (30) days or less, or are owned but not owner-occupied for the duration of any short-term rental period of thirty (30) days or less.

§ 117.51 LICENSE REQUIRED.

No person shall conduct, keep, manage or operate or cause to be conducted, kept, managed or operated a short-term rental without a license therefor as provided in this subchapter. A license shall be obtained for each short-term rental and shall not

be transferable. All such licenses are required to be renewed annually, subject to the same condition as the original license. Such license shall be issued by the City upon payment of the fee as provided in this subchapter. Such fee shall accompany the license application.

§ 117.52 LICENSE ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL.

No license shall be issued or renewed until the short-term rental premises has been inspected and approved by the City to assure compliance with this article.

§ 117.53 LICENSE FEE.

The license fees to be paid annually to the City pursuant to this subchapter shall be as follows:

(A) A non-owner-occupied short-term rental applicant shall pay a fee of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00).

(B) An owner-occupied short-term rental applicant shall pay an annual license fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

§ 117.54 STANDARDS.

In addition to the requirements set forth in this subchapter, no license shall be issued unless the following standards are met:

(A) All owners must use a hosting platform to market a short-term rental. The hosting platform shall be responsible for determining the guest's identification information and the accuracy of that information;

(B) No owner shall rent any short-term rental for any period of time shorter than twenty-four (24) consecutive hours;

(C) The owner must provide proof of homeowner's insurance or host protection insurance in the amount of at least five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) to the City as part of its application;

(D) Every short-term rental shall be subject to inspection by staff members of the City's Fire Department and Health, Housing & Building Department

(E) The owner shall keep a guest register in which the name of every guest and the guest's arrival and departure dates shall be recorded in written form. The owner shall make the guest register freely accessible to any authorized City employee; and

(F) The owner shall post, inside the front entrance to every short-term rental dwelling unit, a short-term rental license issued by the City stating the owner's name, a twenty-four (24)-hour telephone number to reach the owner and the maximum occupancy of the dwelling unit as allowed by this subchapter.

§ 117.55 MAXIMUM OCCUPANCY. No owner shall permit the occupancy of any short-term rental unit to exceed the maximum number of persons in a dwelling unit as set forth below.

§ 117.56 PENALTIES.

(A) Any owner, guest or other person who shall be found to have violated any of the provisions of this subchapter shall be guilty of an offense punishable as follows:

1. The fine for a first violation is two hundred dollars (\$200.00);
2. The fine for a second violation is five hundred dollars (\$500.00); and
3. The fine for a third or subsequent violation is seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00).

(B) Each day a provision of this subchapter is found to have been violated constitutes a separate violation subject to the fine schedule set forth in this section.

(C) Any fines shall be debts due and owing to the City that the City may collect by any means allowed by law, including, but not limited to, filing a lien against the subject property.

(D) The fines provided for herein shall not be construed as limiting the power of a court of competent jurisdiction to impose other penalties and/or remedies as provided for by law. In addition, an owner found to have violated any provisions of this subchapter may be subject to the revocation, suspension or nonrenewal of a license by the City Council.

Section 2. That conflicting Ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force the time this takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalties of Title III (Administration), Chapter 34 (Finance and Revenue; Taxation, Section 34.999 (Penalty) and/or penalties of Title XI (Business Regulations), Chapter 117 (Lodging Business), Section 117.56 (Penalties).

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, in pamphlet form, all as provided by law.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE “CITY”), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That **Section 123.008** is hereby amended by deleting **Sections 123.008(A)(1), 123.008(A)(2) and 123.008(A)(3)**, and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

Subject to the requirements of this chapter and [Chapter 162](#) (Zoning), an adult-use cannabis dispensing organization otherwise validly licensed by the state under the Act must also register annually with the City Clerk and pay an annual registration fee of \$5,000 on or before May 1 of each year; ~~provided, however, that only two adult use cannabis dispensing organizations shall be allowed to operate within the city in accordance with § 55-25(5) of the Act (410 ILCS 705/55-25(5)).~~ In those zoning districts in which an adult-use cannabis dispensing organization may be located, the proposed facility must comply with the following:

(A) Location.

- (1) Facility shall not be located within 100 feet of any church, school, other than an institution of higher learning. In the case of a church, the distance of 100 feet shall be measured to the nearest part of any building used for worship services or educational programs and not to property boundaries.
- (2) Such distances shall be measured linearly and shall be measured along a public path of travel from property line to property line. The requirements under this division shall not be subject to variance.

Section 2. That conflicting ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force at the time of this ordinance takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, all as provided by law.

Section 4. Pursuant to Section 1-2-4 of the Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1-2-4), this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval, due to the urgency of the

necessity to regulate adult-use cannabis business establishments within the City, and same shall further be published in pamphlet form for at least ten (10) days as notice of same, all as provided by law.
